A guide to the ancient history and culture of Sicily featuring good maps and site plans of archaeological sites throughout the island. (Item no. ITL125)

1986, PAPER, 352 PAGES, \$14.95

A richly detailed and personal portrait of Sicily by an American writer who settled on the island with her Sicilian husband in 1962 and stayed for 40 years. Strong on the delights of rural life. (Item no. ITL03)

Midnight in Sicily: On Art, Food, History, Travel and La Cosa Nostra

1999, PAPER, 400 PAGES, \$14.00

A vivid report from Italy's glorious, corrupt and troubled South, this book combines interviews, journalism and essays on Sicilian history and culture. Robb focuses, in part, on the career of Giulio Andreotti, the seven-time prime minister of Italy recently accused of Mafia associations. (Item no. ITL74)

A gripping and evocative 1958 novel of a Sicilian prince and his family, set on a rural estate during the days of independence. (Item no. ITL11)

The Sicilian Vespers, A History of the Mediterranean World in the Later Thirteenth Century

1992, PAPER, 288 PAGES, \$19.00

A spellbinding history of the 13th-century Kingdom of Sicily. The massacre of the French at Palermo, known as the Sicilian Vespers, is the springboard for the author's sweeping depiction of the Mediterranean in the late 1200's. (Item no. ITL295)

The Normans in Sicily

A vivid description of the conquest and 60-year rule of Sicily by the Normans, including a notable cast of adventurers and their legacy of superb cathedrals, churches and palaces. (Item no. ITL294)

Alexander Stille

Excellent Cadavers, The Mafia and the Death of the First Italian Republic

This fast-paced book is a gripping account of corruption in Italy. The author offers an utterly absorbing account of the assassination of two top anti-Mafia prosecutors in 1992. (Item no. ITL58)

Daphne Phelps

A House in Sicily

An old-fashioned memoir of life at Casa Cuseni, the pensione and garden in Taormina run by the indomitable Daphne Phelps, which has been a sanctuary for Tennessee Williams, Bertrand Russell and others since 1947. (Item no. ITL148)

In this personable travelogue Lewis ranges widely, introducing a cast of friends, journalists and residents from one end of the island to the other. He story starts with his first acquaintance with Sicily more than 60 years ago and ends in 1998. (Item no. ITL420)

The Italians

The definitive portrait of the Italian people and a classic essay on the Italian character. Though first published in 1964, it's still worth reading for its insight, grace and wit. (Item no. ITL05)

The Stone Boudoir, Travels Through the Hidden Villages of Sicily

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Heartfelt and evocative, this series of essays captures the author's enchantment with out-of-the-way places in Sicily. (Item no. ITL495)
