Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Budapest today.

Budapest → 3 nights

Day 2: Arrival in Budapest

Included meals: welcome dinner

Welcome to Hungary! Meet your Tour Director and fellow travelers at tonight's welcome dinner.

Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Budapest & Christmas market visit

Included meals: breakfast

Discover the major landmarks of the city that straddles east and west.

- Trace this nation's stormy history at Heroes' Square
- View the Gothic Hungarian Parliament Building located on the banks of the Danube
- Step inside the recently restored Hungarian State Opera House for a guided tour of the incredible new-Renaissance style masterpiece
- Cross the Danube and ascend Castle Hill and take in the breathtaking views from Fisherman's Bastion
- Visit the medieval Matthias Church, once the site of Hapsburg coronations
- Get an introduction to Budapest's lively Christmas markets and explore the bustling stalls at your leisure

Day 5: Transfer to Vienna & Christmas market visit

Travel west through the Danube basin en route to Vienna, Austria and get settled into your hotel.

Sit down for an included dinner. Then, enjoy a mulled wine tasting at another of the city's Christmas markets.

Day 6: Sightseeing tour of Vienna & Christmas market visit

Get transported back to the Age of Empires on a guided tour of Vienna.

- Step inside Belvedere Palace, home to the world's largest collection of paintings by artist Gustav Klimt, and admire the palace's impressive gardens
- Travel down the Ringstrasse, passing the Parliament building, Vienna State Opera, and Kunsthistorisches Museum
- See the grand Hofburg Palace, the Hapsburg's preferred winter residence
- Spend free time exploring the city's Christmas markets

Day 8: Prague via Lednice Castle

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Drive through the pastoral landscapes of Bohemia on your way to Prague, one of Europe's most beautiful cities. En route, stop in Moravia to enter Chateau Lednice, a gorgeous castle on the Austrian border.

Continue on to Prague and sit down for an included dinner.

Day 9: Sightseeing tour of Prague & Christmas market visit

Included meals: breakfast

Discover why Prague is known as the City of One Hundred Spires on a guided tour.

- Visit Prague Castle, from which Charles IV governed the Holy Roman Empire
- Admire the soaring Gothic vaults of St. Vitus Cathedral

- Walk down to the Malá Strana district to sip a coffee at a local cafe
- Cross the elegant Charles Bridge for breathtaking views of the city
- Stroll through Old Town Square to view the 15th-century Astronomical Clock

Then, learn about the city's Christmas markets from your local guide before taking time to explore on your own.

- Discover Wawel Hill, perched high above the Vistula River
- Visit Wawel Cathedral, where Polish kings were crowned
- Stroll through Główny Square
- Pass beautiful Sukiennice Cloth Hall, the Jagiellonian University, and Oskar Schindler's Enamel Factory
- Visit some of Poland's best Christmas markets and take free time to explore

Day 13: Transfer to Warsaw

Day 14: Sightseeing tour of Warsaw & Christmas market visit

Included meals: breakfast, farewell dinner

On a guided tour, get to know Warsaw, a city all but destroyed during World War II and painstakingly rebuilt since 1944.

- See the Chopin Monument at Łazienki Park and walk through the Old Town
- Visit the Jewish Ghetto and the Jewish Memorial
- Discover Starego Miasta Square's Renaissance facades and Baroque townhouses
- Walk through the Old Town
- Enter the Museum of Warsaw to learn about the city's history
- Enjoy free time to explore Warsaw's best Christmas markets

Celebrate your trip during a farewell dinner this evening.

Flight Home

Day 15: Departure

A local guide introduces you to the monuments of Berlin's intricate past as well as the signs of its re-emergence as a vibrant cultural center.

- Discover the Brandenburg Gate, the symbol of a reunited Berlin
- See the Holocaust Memorial and the Berlin Wall's East Side Gallery
- Journey down Unter den Linden, the city's most elegant boulevard, passing the Reichstag and Museum Island

Day 3: Wine Cellar Dinner & Unicum Tasting

\$135 (5 hours, departs in the afternoon, dinner included)

During a visit to the Zwack Unicum Heritage Visitors' Centre in Budapest, you'll learn about the fascinating legacy of Unicum liqueur. A secret formula of more than 40 herbs, the recipe has been protected by the Zwack family since 1790 and its story follows the turbulent history of the area—when the family escaped communism and lived in exile in the U.S., a trusted friend in Milan kept up production. Explore the on-site museum and view the staggering collection of miniature bottles before sampling the aperitif. Then, head to a nearby wine cellar to enjoy a Hungarian dinner accompanied by wine pairings chosen by a local sommelier who'll be on hand to tell you about each selection. One of the wines you'll have the opportunity to taste is Tokaji, a hard-to-find varietal that's deeply rooted within the Kingdom of Hungary. The wine is so closely tied to the country that it's even mentioned in the Hungarian national anthem. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.

Day 4: Budapest Cooking Class & Lunch

\$169/\$179* (4 hours, departs in the morning)

Characterized by soul-warming soups, generous helpings of meat, and plenty of paprika, Hungarian cuisine is so much more than goulash. On this optional outing, you'll try your hand at preparing traditional and modern dishes, with guidance from professional chefs, at a local cooking school. Hear about the nation's culinary history, then learn how to make plates like chicken paprikash (well-seasoned, slow-cooked poultry served with egg noodles), fasirt (breaded, fried pork patties), and almás rétes (the local take on apple strudel) during a private lesson. Then, sit down for lunch and enjoy your creations, accompanied by beer or wine. Can't wait to cook them again? You'll receive a recipe booklet at the end of class!

Day 6: Traditional Viennese Heurigen Evening

\$119/\$129* (4 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

After a brief drive, your first stop is Vienna's Prater Ferris Wheel. Take a breezy ride to the top, which offers a one-of-a-kind view of the city. Next, continue on to a picturesque village and sit down at local restaurant where you'll indulge in a festive night of music, food, and entertainment. Dinner will feature dishes typical of traditional Austrian Heurigen, or wine taverns. During your meal, you'll have the chance to try some of the tavern's own locally made wine—the perfect addition to your cozy, Old-World setting.

Day 7: Bratislava

\$99/\$109* (6 hours, departs in the morning with lunch)

Walk through Bratislava's Old Town on a guided tour of the Slovakian capital. Stroll along cobblestone streets in the shadow of Bratislavský Hrad, the hilltop 18th-century castle overlooking the Old Town. Then, tour the famous Hall of Mirrors inside the pink Primates' Palace, where Napoleon and the Austrian emperor signed the Peace of Pressburg of 1805. Lunch is included. Please note: This excursion is seasonal and runs from November to March. If the excursion falls on a Monday, when Primate's Palace is closed, you will visit St. Martin's Cathedral.

Day 9: Walking Tour of Prague's Jewish Quarter

\$115/\$125* (3.5 hours, departs in the afternoon, lunch included)

Head to Josefov, Prague's Jewish Quarter, nestled between the Vltava River and Old Town Square. You'll enjoy a lunch of regional specialties at a nearby restaurant and join a local guide for a walking tour of the Quarter's remains, which survived devastation during World War II and oppression during the Communist era. Afterward, pay a visit to the Jewish Museum of Prague, housed in a collection of former synagogues, one of which displays the names of all the Czechs sent to concentration camps. You'll learn about the Golem myth, a story forever entwined with Prague's Jewish history, and see sites once frequented by Franz Kafka, the enigmatic author of "The Trial" and "Metamorphosis." Please note: This excursion involves a significant amount of walking and standing. On some departures, this excursion will begin with the walking tour of the Jewish Quarter and end with lunch at a local restaurant.

Day 10: Brandýs Castle & Concert

\$189/\$199* (4 hours, departs in the evening)

Set in a small town just outside of Prague, Brandýs Castle was a summer home for Habsburg monarchs for over five centuries. Today, you'll drive out to the village of Brandýs nad Labem for a special evening in this Renaissance-era monument. Upon arrival, you'll be welcomed by staff and embark on a guided tour of the property's grounds and rooms, learning about its history as you go. Afterward, take a seat in the concert hall for a private performance by some of the area's top musicians. Cap your visit with a post-show glass of wine, served alongside other refreshments, before returning to your hotel in Prague.

Day 12: Auschwitz

\$65 (6 hours, departs in the afternoon)

This excursion takes you to some of the most chilling sites in Europe: the concentration camps at Auschwitz and Birkenau. More than 4 million people were systematically exterminated in these camps by the Third Reich during World War II. Liberated by the Red Army in 1945, Auschwitz has been turned into a poignant memorial to the victims of the Holocaust. Take a guided tour which includes views of chambers and prisoner buildings. Afterward, drive to nearby Birkenau, the

second portion of the larger Auschwitz concentration camp complex. Embark on a guided tour before returning to Kraków. Please note: Full passport information is required to purchase tickets to Auschwitz. Travelers who have not confirmed passport information may do so by logging in to My Account or contacting Customer Experience. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.

Day 13: Chopin Recital & Dinner

\$119/\$129* (5 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

This evening, enjoy a private recital featuring the music of Frédéric-François Chopin. Born in 1810, Chopin is widely considered the world's best composer for piano, an instrument that's featured prominently in his compositions. Tonight, experience Chopin's genius firsthand as a pianist plays some of his greatest masterpieces. Then, sample local specialties at one of Warsaw's finest restaurants during an included dinner.

Extension excursion options

Day 16: World War II Walking Tour

\$79/\$89* (5 hours, departs in the afternoon, lunch included)

Take a walk through history on this insider's tour of Berlin during World War II, detailing the rise and fall of Hitler and the Third Reich. You'll start in the Wilhelmstrasse area and see the building that once housed the headquarters of Hermann Goering's Luftwaffe. You'll also view the former headquarters of the infamous SS and Gestapo, the massive Reich Chancellery, and the Propaganda Ministry. Finally, stand directly above Hitler's Führerbunker as your guide details the last days of World War II in Europe. Lunch is included.

Day 17: Potsdam

\$119/\$129* (6 hours, departs in the morning)

Travel to Potsdam, the residence of Prussian Kings and German Kaisers until 1918. Once the royal playground of Prussian King Frederick the Great, Potsdam was also the location where American, British, and Soviet leaders drew up plans for the postwar administration of Germany at the Potsdam Conference in 1945. A local guide will escort you through Cecilienhof Palace, built by Emperor Wilhelm II of Germany in the early 1900s and the site of the Potsdam Conference's iconic photograph of Truman, Churchill, and Stalin. After exploring the palace and gardens, your guide will introduce you to the historic center of Potsdam.
