With fellow solo travelers by your side, you'll decipher hieroglyphics at towering temples, stand in the shadows of the Pyramids of Giza, and take to the Nile by boat—because no trip to Egypt is complete until you discover the wonders of Africa's longest, and most storied, river.

On this guided tour, you'll walk for at least 2.5 hours daily across uneven terrain, including cobblestone streets and paved roads, with some hills and stairs.

Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Cairo today.

Day 2: Arrival in Cairo

Included meals: dinner

Welcome to Egypt! This evening, enjoy an included dinner at your hotel on your own.

Day 3: Pyramids of Giza & the Grand Egyptian Museum

Included meals: breakfast, welcome dinner
Meet up with a professional Egyptologist, who's
also your Tour Director, and set off on a guided
tour of Giza.

- Uncover the Pyramids of Giza, the only Wonder of the Ancient World to have survived the modern era
- Visit the enigmatic Great Sphinx, the largest monolith statue in the world
- Enjoy an included lunch at a local restaurant
- Enter the Grand Egyptian Museum, the world's largest museum, and explore the vast collection of ancient Egyptian artifacts alongside your Egyptologist

Please note: If the Grand Egyptian Museum is not yet open to the public, a visit to Saqqara & the Imhotep Museum will take its place.

Later, gather with your Tour Director and fellow group members at a mixer before enjoying a welcome dinner.

Aswan → 1 night

Day 4: Flight to Aswan

Included meals: breakfast

Fly to Aswan this morning and enjoy free time for the rest of the day, or add an evening excursion.

Please note: On some departures, the sightseeing tour of Aswan may take place on day 4.

Nile River Cruise → 3 nights

Day 5: Sightseeing tour of Aswan & cruise embarkation

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner Enjoy a free morning in Aswan or add an excursion.

This afternoon, board your cruise ship and enjoy an included lunch while enjoying views of the Nile River. Afterwards, set off on a sightseeing tour of Aswan led by your Egyptologist.

- Board a boat and visit the temples at Philae, located on an island in the Nile River
- Enjoy a walking tour of the island and visit sites like the Temple of Isis, which features scenes of Isis's life carved along the walls
- Walk through the local market and enjoy free time to peruse the various shop stalls

Sit down for an included dinner aboard the ship this evening.

Please note: On some departures, the sightseeing tour of Aswan may take place on day 4.

Day 6: Sightseeing tour of the Temple of Kom Ombo & Edfu

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner Later, set sail for Kom Ombo and Edfu this morning and disembark your ship for guided tours with your Egyptologist leading the way.

- Visit the Temple of Kom Ombo, built during the Greco-Roman period and noted for its twin deities, Sobek and Horus
- Enjoy an included lunch aboard the ship as you cruise to Edfu

Spend a free afternoon in Edfu or add an excursion.

Sit down for an included dinner aboard the ship this evening.

Day 7: Sightseeing tour of Karnak & Luxor

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner
Continue your exploration of the wonders of
Egypt today by seeing the painstakingly
excavated Temple of Karnak and Luxor, once
connected by an avenue of sphinxes, with your
Egyptologist.

- Enter Karnak Temple for a walking tour through the complex to see the Precinct of Amun Re, walls of hieroglyphics, and the Temple of Khonsu
- Walk through Luxor Temple, located on the banks of the Nile River

 View obelisks, statues, and the Abu Haggag Mosque

Enjoy lunch aboard the ship. Then, spend a free afternoon in Luxor.

This evening, sit down for an included dinner aboard the ship.

Cairo → 1 night

Day 8: West Bank, Valley of the Kings, Disembarkation & flight to Cairo

Included meals: breakfast, farewell dinner Enjoy a free early morning aboard the ship or add an excursion.

Later, spend time touring the Nile's West Bank with your Egyptologist as your guide.

- Explore the Valley of the Kings, a series of tombs hidden in the Theban hills
- Enter King Tut's tomb, famous for the ancient Egyptian treasures found inside the complex tomb

Disembark from your cruise this afternoon and fly to Cairo.

Celebrate your trip with your fellow travelers during tonight's farewell dinner.

Flight Home

Day 9: Departure

Included meals: breakfast (excluding early morning departures)

Transfer to the airport to board your flight home, or extend your stay to explore Alexandria and see more of Cairo.

+ Alexandria & Cairo extension

Extend your trip and travel to Egypt's secondlargest city, Alexandria. There, you'll explore the Bibliotheca Alexandrina—the modern successor to the famous Library of Alexandria that was destroyed centuries ago. Then, return to Cairo to explore the Medieval Islamic area of the city with your Tour Director.

Alexandria → 2 nights

Day 9: Transfer to Alexandria & sightseeing tour

Included meals: breakfast, lunch
Make your way to the Egyptian coastal city of
Alexandria and set out on a sightseeing tour.

- Sit down for an included lunch at a local, seaside restaurant situated along the Mediterranean promenade
- Enter the Bibliotheca Alexandrina, a major library and cultural center on Alexandria's Mediterranean coast
- Drive along the Corniche waterfront to the 15th-century Citadel of Qaitbay, a fortress built on the former site of the Lighthouse of Alexandria
- Climb to the ramparts of the Citadel and take in amazing views of the city and harbor

Day 10: Catacombs of Kom el Shoqafa & Royal Jewelry Museum

Included meals: breakfast, lunch
Spend the morning discovering what secrets lie
beneath Alexandria before learning more about
the Egyptian royal family.

- Visit the Catacombs of Kom el Shoqafa, Egypt's largest known Roman funerary complex
- View the recently excavated Roman amphitheatre and Pompey's Pillar
- Head to the Royal Jewelry Museum, a grand, former palace where collectibles of the Egyptian royal family are on display
- Explore the family's immense collection of jewelry, as well as chess boards, binoculars, drinking vessels, and other items that are adorned with precious stones
- Enjoy an included lunch at a local restaurant

Cairo \rightarrow 1 night

Day 11: Transfer to Cairo & sightseeing tour

Included meals: breakfast, farewell dinner
Travel back to Cairo this morning, then visit the
Gayer-Anderson Museum. Set in a 17th-century
former home that's considered one of the most
remarkable examples of Muslim domestic
architecture in Cairo. You'll see Egyptian art,
carpets, other unique/rare collectibles as you
explore the museum with your Tour Director.
Celebrate your trip with your fellow travelers
during tonight's farewell dinner.

Flight Home

Day 12: Departure

Included meals: breakfast (excluding early morning departures)

Transfer to the airport for your flight home.

Day 4: Aswan Sunset Felucca Ride & Dinner

\$125CAD/\$135CAD* (4 hours, departs in the afternoon, dinner included)
Board a felucca, a traditional Egyptian sailboat, in Aswan and relax as you float down the Nile River. You'll view the east and west banks of the river and soak in views of Elephantine Island as you learn about the local lifestyle in this region. Then, head back to the boat to watch the sun dip below the horizon before disembarking for a meal at a local restaurant. You'll dine on traditional Egyptian cuisine paired with tea.

Day 5: Abu Simbel

\$529CAD (6 hours, departs in the morning)
Fly from Aswan to Abu Simbel, where you'll visit the temples of Ramses II and his wife Nefertari, relocated block by block to the shores of Lake Nasser after the construction of the Aswan High Dam. The temples' statues now stand 680 feet from their original site but their grandeur endures. Please note: This excursion involves extensive walking on rugged terrain, so sturdy footwear is advised. Headwear and extra sunscreen are also recommended. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 70 days prior to departure.

Day 6: Edfu & the Temple of Horus

\$105CAD/\$115CAD* (3 hours, departure time varies)
Preserved by layers of sand for millennia, the Temple of
Horus in Edfu is striking thanks to its size and
completeness. Dedicated to the falcon god Horus, this
grand temple complex was a center of religious life
before non-Christian worship was banned in the Roman
Empire. Disembark your cruise this morning in Edfu and
spend time exploring the temple alongside your Tour
Director. Visit the court of offerings, the inner and outer
hypostyle halls, the offering chamber, and the sanctuary
of Horus, all of which date back to between 237 and 57
BC.

Day 8: Nile River Hot Air Balloon Ride

\$235CAD/\$245CAD* (2 hours, departs in the early morning)

This morning, rise with the sun and float above ancient temples, the Nile, and the Valley of Kings. Begin with crossing the Nile by ferry to the West Bank where you'll then transfer by bus before taking to the skies aboard your balloon. After watching the balloon inflation, you'll gently soar into the air and get a truly impressive view of Egypt's archaeological history. Please note: This activity is weather-dependent. We recommend wearing layers for the cooler morning weather.
