#### Day 1: Travel day

# $\textbf{Dublin} \rightarrow 2 \text{ nights}$

#### Day 2: Arrival in Dublin

Included meals: welcome dinner Welcome to Ireland! Meet your Tour Director and fellow travelers at tonight's welcome dinner.

#### Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Dublin

Included meals: breakfast

Take a comprehensive tour of Ireland's capital city with a local expert leading the way.

- Stop in Phoenix Park, site of the presidential residence, and pass by the Guinness Brewery.
- Step inside the soaring St. Patrick's Cathedral, Ireland's largest church.
- Pass St Stephen's Green and admire the Georgian architecture of Merrion Square as you go.
- See Trinity College and enjoy a walking tour of the college grounds.

# **County Cork** $\rightarrow$ 2 nights

#### Day 4: Cork via the Kilkenny Castle & Rock of Cashel

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Travel to Cork, stopping for several guided visits along the way.

- Stop in Kilkenny, Ireland's best-preserved medieval town.
- Tour the imposing 12th-century Kilkenny Castle, overlooking the River Nore.
- Take a tour of the iconic Rock of Cashel, commanding stone buildings that date back to the 12th and 13th centuries.

Sit down for an included dinner this evening.

#### Day 5: Cobh & Blarney Castle

Included meals: breakfast

Get a feel for the many sides of Ireland, from charming villages to vibrant cities and iconic castles.

- Discover the town of Cobh, once a launch site for ships bound for North America.
- Visit the Cobh Heritage Centre, whose exhibits tell the story of Irish emigration over the past 150 years.
- Stop at Blarney Castle to kiss the legendary Blarney Stone.

# County Kerry $\rightarrow$ 2 nights

#### Day 6: County Kerry via Muckross House

Included meals: breakfast, dinner Transfer to County Kerry today, stopping at Muckross House. Take time to explore this Victorian mansion and stroll through its beautifully manicured gardens. Sit down for an included dinner this evening.

#### Day 7: The Ring of Kerry & Killarney National Park

Included meals: breakfast Set out on the Ring of Kerry, a 112-mile coastal route that covers some of Ireland's most spectacular scenery.

- Pass the pristine Lakes of Killarney in Killarney National Park and gaze across Dingle Bay.
- Enjoy unsurpassable views of mountains, beaches, and the Atlantic Ocean.
- Explore the picturesque villages that line the Ring of Kerry including the village of Sneem, "The Knot in the Ring."

# **Galway** $\rightarrow$ 2 nights

#### Day 8: Galway via Cliffs of Moher & the Burren

Included meals: breakfast

Head north to Galway today, taking time to view spectacular scenery en route.

• Walk along the mesmerizing coastline of the Cliffs of Moher. • Pass through the Burren, a unique limestone plateau where fields of rock are dotted with wildflowers.

Continue on to Galway and discover the local energy and living traditions of Ireland's thirdlargest city with your Tour Director.

- Stroll past Lynch's Castle, the Druid Theatre Company, and the broad expanse of Eyre Square.
- View the city's medieval walls and Spanish Arch.
- Peruse authentic Claddagh rings in a local shop.

Enjoy a free evening in Galway where, maybe hit up a local pub and listen to live traditional Gaelic music the city is famous for.

#### Day 9: Free day in Galway

#### Day 10: Transfer to County Dublin & Teeling Whiskey Distillery

• Sample some of the whisky during a tasting. This evening, celebrate your trip at a farewell dinner with your fellow travelers in County Dublin.

# Flight Home

# $\textbf{Belfast} \rightarrow 2 \text{ nights}$

#### Day 11: Sightseeing tour of Belfast

Included meals: breakfast

Journey to Belfast, the cultural heart of Northern Ireland, where you'll get the local perspective of the city on a guided tour.

- Glimpse the copper-domed City Hall and the recently restored Grand Opera House.
- Learn all about Belfast's long history, from its origins in the Bronze Age and rise as an international seaport to its role in the conflict known as The Troubles.
- Enter the Titanic Belfast Museum for a look at the vessel's infamous history.

#### Day 12: Free day in Belfast

Included meals: breakfast Spend a free day in Belfast or add an excursion. Tonight, enjoy a farewell drink as you celebrate your trip with your fellow travelers.

#### Day 3: Glendalough

\$55/\$65\* (5 hours, departure time varies) County Wicklow has some of the wildest and most spectacular mountain scenery in Ireland, as well as many of the country's most important historic sites. Journey through Wicklow's captivating landscapes to Glendalough, which became famous throughout Europe as a center of Christian learning. Saint Laurence O'Toole became the Abbot of Glendalough in 1154 and worked to bring the Irish Church closer to the Roman Church. You'll learn more about O'Toole, who went on to become the Archbishop of Dublin, and his work in Glendalough as you visit St. Kevin's Cross, the remains of the sixth-century cathedral, and the remarkable Round Tower. Your Tour Director will lead you on a tour of the site, and then you'll enjoy free time.

#### Day 9: Aran Islands

\$129/\$139\* (9 hours, departs in the morning, lunch included)

Board a ferry across Galway Bay for a guided tour of Inis Mór, one of the three remote Aran Islands. These islands represent an outpost of Irish culture that has remained essentially unchanged over the past few centuries—the Aran Islanders still speak Gaelic and rely on fishing and farming to make a living. Local crafts produced here include hand-knit "fisherman" sweaters. While you're here, you'll visit the ruins of Dún Aonghasa, a prehistoric fort, and enjoy an included lunch at a restaurant on the island. Please note: This excursion is seasonal and runs from April through October. It involves a fair amount of walking over somewhat rugged terrain. Travelers should be accustomed to moderate physical activity. This excursion is weatherdependent, and weather conditions may also result in a rough sea crossing.

#### **Extension excursion options**

#### Day 12: Giant's Causeway

\$95/\$105\* (6 hours, departure time varies) Pay a visit to the rugged Giant's Causeway, a series of naturally formed basalt columns. The hexagonal columns, which you can walk on, are 60 million years old and originated as volcanic lava. A colorful local legend says that mythical giant Finn McCool built the walkway so that he could cross the sea to Scotland. Please note: Raingear is recommended for this excursion.
