San José → 1 night

Day 1: Arrival in San José

Included meals: light dinner

Welcome to Costa Rica! Settle in to your hotel and enjoy an included dinner.

Please note: Travelers arriving at the hotel late this evening will have an informal dinner.

Monteverde → 2 nights

Day 2: Transfer to Monteverde & hiking tour of Santa Elena Cloud Forest Reserve

Included meals: breakfast, welcome lunch

Leave the city behind and head to the mountainous town of Monteverde, where you'll sit down with your fellow travelers for a welcome lunch at a local, family-owned ranch. Join your Tour Director for an afternoon hike through Santa Elena Cloud Forest Reserve, a haven for birdwatchers.

- Learn about variety of flora and fauna, including orchids and ferns
- Walk through the misty forest as you explore this rare ecosystem, which gets its name from the constant cloud coverage
- Try to spot toucans, hummingbirds, resplendent quetzals, and more

Please note: Travelers should be able to hike around two miles over wet, and potentially slippery, pathways.

Day 3: Heliconia Ranch

Included meals: breakfast, lunch

Learn about Costa Rica's diverse ecology and vibrant culture today.

- Help with reforestation efforts by planting a native tree at Heliconia Ranch
- Enjoy an included lunch as you watch traditional Costa Rican dances performed by children from the community

Spend a free afternoon in Monteverde or add an excursion.

Day 4: Manuel Antonio National Park

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Make your way south to the country's smallest national park, popular for its breathtaking beaches and scenic hiking trails. Uncover it's incredible biodiversity and postcard-worthy beaches on a guided tour.

- Keep an eye out for some of the 109 mammal species and 270 bird species that call the park home
- Walk to the top of rocky Cathedral Point to view the park from across the Pacific
- See the blowhole at Escondido Beach
- Survey the saw cliff and sea caves at Serrucho Point
- Relax on the beach or take a dip in the Pacific Ocean

Sit down for an included dinner this evening.

Day 5: Tárcoles River cruise

Included meals: breakfast

Travel to the quiet town of Tárcoles and set out on a riverboat tour of the Tárcoles River led by a local guide.

- Soak in views of lush mangrove forests and jungle scenery
- Look out for wildlife such as crocodiles, iguanas, lizards, monkeys, and birds

Enjoy a free afternoon in Manuel Antonio or add an excursion.

Boquete → 2 nights

Day 6: Transfer to Boquete

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Cross the border into Panama today and meet up with your Panamanian Tour Director as you make your way to the town of Boquete, which is located in the mountains and known for its year-round temperate weather.

Then, enjoy an included dinner at a local restaurant this evening.

Day 7: Coffee farm & factory tour

Included meals: breakfast, tasting

Spend a free morning in Boquete or add an excursion.

This afternoon, take a guided tour of a local coffee farm and factory to learn about the region's connection to the flavorful beverage.

- Explore the farm to learn about the process of growing and harvesting coffee beans
 - Walk through the factory to see how the beans are roasted
 - Sample award-winning Gesha coffee, a rare type of coffee made from beans that are only grown in a few countries across the globe

Chitré Region → 1 night

Day 8: Transfer to the Chitré Region & sightseeing tour of artisan workshops

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner

Travel south to the Chitré Region to discover why this area is considered the cultural cradle of Panama. You'll take a guided tour after an included lunch to get to know four local craftspeople located in Chitré and the picturesque town of Parita.

- Meet a drum-maker and learn how the artisan creates this popular instrument as you enjoy a musical demonstration
- Step inside a pottery workshop to meet a potter who will demonstrate how to make ceramics in a handmade oven
- Visit a family of mask-makers to hear how they research and design the traditional Diablico Sucio masks
- Interact with a family of textile workers who specialize in creating polleras, colorful Latin American skirts, which can take years to complete
- See the colorful designs, as well as the threading and sewing techniques, as the artisans talk about the history and significance of the skirts

Enjoy an included dinner this evening.

Panama City → 3 nights

Day 9: Transfer to Panama City, Panama Canal cruise & Miraflores Locks

Included meals: breakfast

Travel to Panama City and spend the day exploring the legendary Panama Canal —a feat of engineering.

- Board a covered boat in the town of Gamboa and float alongside commercial and private boats as you sail along Gatun Lake
- Learn about the manmade lake, which plays an essential role in helping ships pass through the Panama Canal
- Try to spot wildlife including Panamanian tamarins, green iguanas, crocodiles, and birds along the lake's jungle-lined shoreline

After your boat ride, head to the Miraflores Locks and enjoy exclusive access to one of the most important areas of the Panama Canal.

- Step inside the Miraflores Visitor Center to discover how the canal was built
- Stand within a few feet of incoming ships and watch as they cross through the locks

Please note: On some departures the Miraflores Locks may be replaced with entrance to the Miraflores Museum due to closures.

Day 10: Sightseeing tour of Panama City

Included meals: breakfast, tasting

Meet up with a local guide and spend some time exploring Panama's capital city.

- Pass the Frank Gehry-designed Biomuseo and view the city's modern architecture as you drive down Amador Causeway
- Take a walking tour of the UNESCO-listed Casco Viejo neighborhood
- Visit the Plaza de Francia, a memorial dedicated to the French laborers who lost their lives in the first failed attempt to dig the Panama Canal
- Visit Plaza de la Independencia to see where Panama declared independence from Colombia
- Step inside the Church of San Jose to marvel at the ornate Golden Altar and see the Metropolitan Cathedral
- Stop at shop to sample local chocolates and rum
- Walk through Parque De Santa Ana and past the historic La Avenida Central shopping street
- Learn about the culture in El Chorrillo neighborhood, which was bombed during the U.S. invasion of Panama in 1989
- Enjoy free time for lunch in the Casco Viejo neighborhood

Spend a free afternoon in Panama City or add an excursion.

Day 11: Chagres National Park & Emberá

community visit

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, farewell dinner

Leave Panama City behind and head into the lush rainforests of Chagres National Park.

- Board a traditional dugout canoe for a ride up the Chagres River, soaking in the jungle scenery as you go
- Head to a village where the indigenous Emberá people, known as the keepers of the rainforest, have lived for thousands of years
- Learn about the Emberá community and way of life, including lessons in traditional medicine and cultural dance
- See how their culture exists in harmony with the surrounding rainforest
- Enjoy an included lunch in the village before returning to Panama City

Head to a local restaurant and celebrate your trip during a farewell dinner with your fellow travelers.

Flight Home

Day 12: Departure

Included meals: breakfast (excluding early morning departures)

Transfer to the airport for your flight home or continue on to Cartagena, Colombia.

Fly to Cartagena, one of the Caribbean's most historic spots, to continue your adventure. You'll explore the UNESCO-listed city on a sightseeing tour, and even enjoy a little beach time while you're at it.

Cartagena → 3 nights

Day 12: Flight to Cartagena & dance class

Included meals: breakfast

Fly to Cartagena, Colombia today.

This afternoon, take part in a class led by a local dancer to learn how to dance salsa and cumbia.

- Follow along as your instructor shows you how to properly perform signature salsa moves
- Move to the beat as you learn about the roots of cumbia, a local dance style created by enslaved Black and indigenous people

Spend a free evening in the city or add an excursion.

Day 13: Sightseeing tour of Cartagena

Included meals: breakfast

Set off on a walking tour to explore Cartagena's colorful and historic UNESCO-recognized Old Town alongside a local guide.

- Stroll through the beautiful Plaza de Bolívar as you learn about the park's connection to the fight for Colombian independence
- Tour the Inquisition Palace to see a variety of artifacts and exhibits that highlight the country's cultural heritage
- Visit San Felipe de Barajas Castle, a grand fortress built by the Spaniards that sits atop the Hill of San Lázaro

Enjoy a free afternoon in Cartagena or add an excursion.

Day 3: Sky Walk

\$89CAD/\$99CAD* (time length varies, departure time varies)

The canopy layer of the Costa Rican rainforest teems with life, but until recently, it was difficult for travelers to enter this world. On today's excursion, a guided tour brings you to a series of suspended bridges high above the floor of the Monteverde cloud forest.

Day 5: Manual Antonio Catamaran Cruise

\$159CAD/\$169CAD* (3 hours, departure time varies)

Spend the afternoon cruising along the central Pacific coast of Quepos on board the Ocean King catamaran, the largest in Central America. Sail through the various islands and rock formations as you explore Manuel Antonio National Park from the water, keeping an eye out for dolphins and sea birds that inhabit the area.

Snorkel in the calm turquoise waters as you explore the underwater beauty up close. Please note: This excursion is weather-dependent and will run in the afternoon from January to March and in the morning from April through mid-December.

Day 7: Cloud Forest Nature Walk & Bird Watching

\$89CAD/\$99CAD* (3 hours, departs in the morning)

On the outskirts of Volcán Barú National Park sits a stunning cloud forest that's home to a variety of flora and fauna. On today's excursion, you'll set out on a hike to explore this remote rainforest with a local guide. Walk along one of the park's well-maintained trails and stay on the lookout for rare local wildlife including the resplendent quetzal bird, sloths, and monkeys.

Day 10: Casco Viejo & Cinta Costera Bike Tour

\$65CAD/\$75CAD* (3 hours, departs in the afternoon)

Explore the historic district of Panama on a guided bike tour. Meet up with a local guide in the heart of Casco Viejo along the Simon Bolivar Plaza and embark on a three-hour bike ride. Ride past landmarks like Plaza Simon Bolivar, the Arco Chato, Plaza de Francia, La Bóvedas, and the local artisan mini market. Then, make your way to the waterfront and bike along Cinta Costera, taking in beautiful views of the ocean and city. Stop at a local market, and cool down with some ceviche and a refreshing drink before returning to your hotel.

Extension excursion options

Day 12: Cartagena Cooking Class & Dinner

\$169CAD/\$179CAD* (4 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Spend the evening at a restaurant enjoying a cooking demonstration to see how to make flavorful local foods followed by a delicious included dinner.

Day 13: Boquilla Mangroves & Afro-Caribbean Drum Lesson

\$125CAD/\$135CAD* (3 hours, departs in the

afternoon)

Start the day by visiting the fishing village of La Boquilla where you'll explore the lush mangroves by boat with a native guide. Board a traditional wooden canoe as a local guides you through the waterways. You'll see the variety of flora and fauna that flourish within the unique ecosystem. Then, disembark your canoe to enjoy an Afro-Caribbean music and drumming lesson on the beach near the fishing village. Afro-Caribbean music traces its roots back to West and Central Africa, having been brought to Latin America during the trans-Atlantic slave trade. In Colombia, this music style often incorporates the celebratory rhythms found in Trinidadian Calypso and improvisational elements typical of Cuban descarga. You'll learn all about the music from the locals as you try your hand at recreating the upbeat tunes. After, travel back to Cartagena.

Day 14: A Day on Isla Barú

\$205CAD/\$215CAD* (10 hours, departs in the morning, lunch included)

Spend the day off the coast of Cartagena and explore Isla Barú, one of the country's most picturesque isles. Isla Barú is home to one of the most stunning white-sand beaches in Colombia and you'll enjoy a free day to relax on the shores of this tropical paradise. Snorkel and swim in the beautiful blue water, lounge on a hammock, or opt to purchase a massage treatment. Enjoy a lunch local coastal specialties. Please note: There are locker rooms and bathrooms on site, as well as a place to buy food and beverages.
