Overnight Flight → 1 night

Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Dublin today.

Dublin → 2 nights

Day 2: Arrival in Dublin

Included meals: welcome dinner

Welcome to Ireland! Settle in to your hotel. Then, meet your Tour Director and fellow travelers at tonight's welcome dinner.

Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Dublin

Included meals: breakfast

Take a comprehensive tour of Ireland's capital city with a local expert leading the way.

- Stop in Phoenix Park, site of the presidential residence, and pass by the Guinness Brewery.
- Step inside the soaring St. Patrick's Cathedral, Ireland's largest church.
- Pass St Stephen's Green and admire the Georgian architecture of Merrion Square as you go.
- See Trinity College and enjoy a walking tour of the college grounds.

Enjoy a free afternoon in Dublin to visit Grafton Street or the Temple Bar district, or add an excursion.

+ Glendalough

County Limerick → 2 nights

Day 4: County Limerick via Kilkenny Castle & Rock of Cashel

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Explore the Irish countryside en route to County Limerick.

- Stop in Kilkenny, Ireland's best-preserved medieval town.
- Pass by the Gothic St. Canice's Cathedral, built in the 13th century.
- Enter the imposing 12th-century Kilkenny Castle, overlooking the River Nore.

- Tour the iconic Rock of Cashel, whose commanding stone buildings date back to the 12th and 13th centuries.

Later, sit down for an included dinner with your group.

Day 5: Free day in County Limerick

Included meals: breakfast

Spend a free day exploring County Limerick or add an excursion.

+ Cliffs of Moher, Pub Lunch & the Burren

Belfast → 2 nights

Day 6: Belfast via County Meath

Included meals: breakfast, tasting

En route to Belfast, stop in County Meath to pay a visit to a local working farm.

- Learn about daily life on an Irish farm.
- See how Irish brown bread is made and enjoy a taste of this traditional food.
- Watch a demonstration of traditional games and dance, like hurling and céilí.

Then, continue on to Belfast.

Day 7: Sightseeing tour of Belfast

Included meals: breakfast

Get to know Belfast, the cultural heart of Northern Ireland, from a local's perspective on a guided tour.

- Marvel at copper-domed Belfast City Hall and the recently restored Grand Opera House.
- Learn all about Belfast's long history, from its origins in the Bronze Age and rise as an international seaport to its role in the conflict known as The Troubles.
- Head inside the Titanic Belfast museum for a look at the vessel's infamous history.

Enjoy a free afternoon in Belfast or add an excursion.

+ Giant's Causeway

County Cavan → 1 night

Day 8: Transfer to Cabra Castle

Included meals: breakfast, farewell dinner

Leave Northern Ireland behind and make your way to County Cavan for a special evening in a historic Irish castle.

- Transfer to Cabra Castle, an 18th-century castle-turned-hotel.
- Enjoy free time to explore the castle's manicured gardens and to walk along trails through Dún a Rí Forest Park.

Celebrate your trip with your fellow travelers at tonight's farewell dinner.

Flight Home

Day 9: Departure

Included meals: breakfast (excluding early morning departures)

Transfer to the Dublin airport for your flight home or extend your stay to explore more of the city.

Day 3: Glendalough

\$69CAD/\$79CAD* (5 hours, departure time varies)

County Wicklow has some of the wildest and most spectacular mountain scenery in Ireland, as well as many of the country's most important historic sites. Journey through Wicklow's captivating landscapes to Glendalough, which became famous throughout Europe as a center of Christian learning. Saint Laurence O'Toole became the Abbot of Glendalough in 1154 and worked to bring the Irish Church closer to the Roman Church. You'll learn more about O'Toole, who went on to become the Archbishop of Dublin, and his work in Glendalough as you visit St. Kevin's Cross, the remains of the sixth-century cathedral, and the remarkable Round Tower. Your Tour Director will lead you on a tour of the site, and then you'll enjoy free time.

Named the third most beautiful in the world by National Geographic, the Italianate gardens of Powerscourt Estate rival even the immaculately manicured flower beds of Versailles. Spend time wandering through these sprawling grounds and exploring the Palladian-style country house that lies at the heart of the property. Once a 13th-century castle, this opulent home underwent extensive renovations in the 1700s to transform it into the grand hall it is today.

Day 5: Cliffs of Moher, Pub Lunch & the Burren

\$115CAD/\$125CAD* (8 hours, departs in the morning, lunch included)

Journey along the coast to the famous Cliffs of Moher. Whether you admire the towering cliffs from a distance or from a paved pathway near their edge, their rugged, natural beauty—and the vast expanse of the Atlantic Ocean beyond them—will amaze you. Afterwards, visit the charming town of Doolin for an included lunch at a local pub. Continue on to the Burren, an austere and otherworldly landscape known for its slate-grey rock fields dotted by rare wildflowers. Please note: This excursion is weather-dependent, and your views may be impacted by fog.

Day 7: Giant's Causeway

\$129CAD/\$139CAD* (6 hours, departure time varies)

Pay a visit to the rugged Giant's Causeway, a series of naturally formed basalt columns. The hexagonal columns, which you can walk on, are 60 million years old and originated as volcanic lava. A colorful local legend says that mythical giant Finn McCool built the walkway so that he could cross the sea to Scotland. Please note: Raingear is recommended for this excursion.

Extension excursion options

Day 9: Traditional Irish Dinner & Show

\$159CAD/\$169CAD* (5 hours, departs in the evening with dinner)

Enjoy this special evening of Irish food, music, and live entertainment. Dinner will be served first, giving you a taste of the country's traditional dishes. You'll then be treated to a live show of Irish music and dance. Join in the fun as you enjoy a merry and memorable night. Please note: The specific venue and day of the week for this excursion may change due to availability. This excursion is seasonal and runs from April through October.

Day 10: Powerscourt Estate & Gardens
