# County Antrim $\rightarrow$ 2 nights

# Day 2: Arrival in Belfast

Included meals: welcome dinner Welcome to the Emerald Isle! Settle in, then gather with your Tour Director and fellow travelers at tonight's welcome dinner.

# Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Belfast

Included meals: breakfast

Learn about Belfast's role in the conflict known as "the Troubles" during today's walking tour.

- Glimpse the copper-domed City Hall, where
   you'll meet your local guide
- Learn about the city's history and your guide's experience growing up during the Troubles
- Listen to expert commentary from your guide as you stop at sites in downtown Belfast connected to the Catholic-Protestant conflict

# County Donegal $\rightarrow$ 2 nights

# Day 4: Donegal via Derry & Glenveagh National Park

Included meals: breakfast, dinner Depart Northern Ireland and cross into the Republic of Ireland, where you'll travel through the dramatic scenery along a portion of the Wild Atlantic Way.

- Stop in Derry, where you'll learn about the city's history on a tour with a local guide
- See the well-preserved 17th-century city walls and learn about the history of the conflicts that took place between the Protestant and Catholic populations
- Visit Glenveagh National Park and set off on an easy, scenic walk along Lough Veagh with your Tour Director
- Enter Glenveagh Castle and admire the park's waterfalls, lakes, and mountains

• Continue through the beautiful Irish countryside to County Donegal

This evening, sit down to an included dinner with your group.

# Day 5: Slieve League

*Included meals: breakfast* Head west to see the highest cliffs in Europe today.

- Pay a visit to the Slieve League Cultural Centre
- Continue on to the Slieve League cliffs for incredible panoramic views from nearly 2,000 feet above sea level
- Opt to join your guide on a walk along the cliffs
- Meet up with a teacher at a local college in the village of Glencolumbkille for an Irish language lesson
- Enter a local weaving shop in Donegal to see a demonstration and learn about the famous Donegal tweed

# **County Mayo** $\rightarrow$ 2 nights

# Day 6: County Mayo via Glencar & Sligo

Included meals: breakfast, liquor tasting, dinner Journey south along the Wild Atlantic Way and through the landscapes immortalized by the poetry of William Butler Yeats.

- Visit Glencar Waterfall, which is mentioned in
   W. B. Yeats' poem titled The Stolen Child
- Enjoy free time for lunch in the town of Sligo
- Stop to try a cup of Irish coffee
- Join an archaeologist local guide at the Carrowmore Megalithic Cemetery, which is home to tombs that are among the most important prehistoric monuments in Europe
- Arrive in the village of Westport in County
  Mayo

Sit down to an included dinner with your group this evening.

# Day 7: Achill Island

Included meals: breakfast

Make your way to Achill Island for a guided tour of the idyllic destination along the Wild Atlantic Way with your Tour Director.

- Pass by many blanket bogs en route to the charming village of Dooagh
- Walk through the landscapes surrounding Keem Bay and visit Keem Beach
- Cross the Michael Davitt Bridge on your way back to Westport

# **County Clare** $\rightarrow$ 2 nights

# Day 8: County Clare via Connemara National Park & Galway

Included meals: breakfast

Venture down the coast to County Clare, making several scenic stops en route.

- Visit the charming village of Leenane
- Spot Ireland's only fjord in Killary Harbor, then soak in views of the Maumturk mountain range en route to Connemara National Park
- Enter Kylemore Abbey and take time to explore its Victorian walled garden
- Drive through the picture-perfect landscapes of Connemara, stopping at the Inagh Valley and Maam Cross
- Arrive in Galway, where you'll follow your Tour Director on a guided walking tour
- Stroll past Lynch's Castle, the Druid Theatre Company, and the broad expanse of Eyre Square
- View the city's medieval walls and Spanish Arch
- Continue on to your hotel in County Clare

# Day 9: The Cliffs of Moher

Included meals: breakfast, farewell dinner Join a local guide for a scenic walk along the Cliffs of Moher.

- Set off on a trail along the mesmerizing coastline of the Cliffs of Moher, which rise 700 feet above the Atlantic Ocean
- Soak in the views from Hag's Head, the southernmost point of the cliffs
- Enjoy free time at the visitor's center

Enjoy free time this afternoon to explore County Clare on your own.

This evening, celebrate your trip with your group at a farewell dinner.

When you picture Ireland, you're probably thinking of County Kerry, home to some of the country's most iconic spots. Continue your trip south along the Wild Atlantic Way to County Kerry and enjoy guided tours of Killarney National Park, then delve into history in neighboring county Limerick.

- Stop at the 200-year-old Dinis Cottage and stroll along a short path that leads to the Meeting of the Waters, where Killarney's Upper Lake flows down to join the lower loughs
- Visit the stately Tudor-style Muckross House, donated to the Irish state in 1932
   Continue on to Dublin and enjoy a farewell

dinner as you celebrate your trip with your fellow group members.

# Day 12: Killarney National Park & transfer to Dublin

Included meals: breakfast, farewell dinner Head to Killarney National Park, Ireland's first national park, which has grown to 25,000 acres of diverse ecological landscapes.

- Take a guided walking tour through Killarney National Park's most magnificent landscapes around Muckross Lake
- Walk along Muckross Peninsula, which
   separates Muckross Lake from Lough Leane
- Try to spot the red squirrels, red deer, lush ferns, and green moss throughout Reenadinna Wood

#### Day 3: Giant's Causeway Cliff Walk

\$99/\$109\* (6 hours, departure time varies) Pay a visit to the rugged Giant's Causeway, a series of 40,000 naturally formed basalt columns. The hexagonal columns, which you can walk on, are 60 million years old and originated as volcanic lava. A colorful local legend says that mythical giant Finn McCool built the walkway so that he could cross the sea to Scotland. Explore the Giant's Causeway Visitor's Center to learn more about its history. You'll also have the option to join your Tour Director for a cliff walk to soak in spectacular views of the causeway and coastline. On a clear day, you can see Scotland and a stretch of the beautiful northern Irish coastline. Please note: Raingear is recommended for this excursion. The cliff walk is optional and travelers can opt to enjoy the visitors center at their own pace.

#### Day 7: Glen Keen Farm & Dinner

\$149 (5.5 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Glen Keen Farm is one of the largest sheep farms in Ireland and while here, you'll learn about sheep farming while soaking in the natural beauty that defines the area. First, watch an interactive sheep herding demonstration followed by a guided walk to a nearby ring fort. These fortified settlements can be found all throughout Ireland and most were built during the Bronze Age. Then, head back to the farm for a traditional dinner of Glen Keen Farm Lamb Stew, dessert, coffee, and tea. Please note: Vegetarian options are available for the included dinner. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.

#### **Extension excursion options**

#### Day 11: Dingle Peninsula Walk & Whiskey Tasting

\$99/\$109\* (8 hours, departs in the morning) Spend the day getting to know the dramatically rugged terrain of the Dingle Peninsula. Take a scenic drive to the Blasket Centre, where you'll embark on a coastal walk along the Lúb na Cille loop trail. This two-hour hike is filled with incredible views of the Irish coastline and farmlands. After, head to the charming, colorful town of Dingle. You'll have free time to visit the shops and restaurants before heading to Dingle Distillery. Join a local guide for a tour of the distillery, which produces whiskey, gin, and vodka. Sit down to enjoy a tasting of their signature whisky, which the distillers have been producing in small, craft batches since 2015.
