




# Jordan History & Culture: Amman, Petra & the Dead Sea

#### Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Amman today.

#### $\textbf{Amman} \rightarrow 3 \text{ nights}$

#### Day 2: Arrival in Amman

Included meals: dinner

Welcome to Jordan! Transfer to your hotel and get settled in.

This evening, enjoy an included dinner on your own.

# Day 3: Iraq Al Amir women's cooperative & sightseeing tour of Amman

Included meals: breakfast, welcome lunch, tasting

Head outside of Amman to visit the Iraq Al Amir women's cooperative, an organization whose aim is to reverse high rates of unemployment among local women.

- Learn how working at the cooperative empowers women to achieve financial independence and raise their standard of living.
- Watch the employees make soap from olive oil and greeting cards from recycled paper.
- Try your hand at making paper or pottery during an interactive workshop.
- Get to know your Tour Director and fellow travelers during a welcome lunch prepared by the women at the collective.

Travel back to Amman this afternoon for a guided tour of Jordan's capital, a modern, hilly city that's home to Roman ruins and more than 2 million people.

- Stroll through bustling local markets as you make your way to the ruins of the Citadel—the Bronze Age complex sits on the city's highest hill, which is known as Jebel Al Qala'a—and the second-century Roman theater, the city's most famous archaeological attraction.
- Step inside King Abdullah Mosque, a beautiful landmark that's dedicated to Jordan's first king and houses some of his personal items.

• Walk through the Old City, where you'll stop for a traditional Jordanian coffee—a beverage whose enjoyment here is deeply rooted in hospitality.

Please note: Travelers are required to remove shoes when entering the King Abdullah Mosque. Women must cover their hair, arms, and legs. Men must cover their legs.

# Day 4: Sightseeing tour of Jerash, Souf & calligraphy lesson

Included meals: breakfast, tasting, lunch Make your way from Amman to the ancient Roman city of Jerash, which is widely regarded as one of the best-preserved Roman provincial towns in the world. Spend the day exploring historic ruins and getting to know Jordanian people and culture.

- Explore some of the world's largest and bestpreserved Roman ruins, including the forum, the amphitheater, and the second-century Temple of Artemis, the latter of which is dedicated to the goddess of hunting and fertility (and the daughter of Zeus and Leto) and is flanked by elaborately carved Corinthian columns.
- Travel to Beit Khairat Souf, a multi-faceted social enterprise and vital community hub that comprises a restaurant and a food product store.
- Meet with some of Beit Khairat Souf's female owners and managers to hear how they help strengthen local women's leadership skills by providing jobs and training.
- Sample some of the collective's delicious homemade jams, pickles, and olive oils sourced for local families, then sit down for an included lunch at the cafe.
- Depart Beit Khairat and travel to the House of Calligraphy in Aljoun, where you'll learn about the history of Arabic calligraphy and how it's closely connected with Islamic culture.
- Grab a traditional dried reed pen and learn how to write your name in your favorite calligraphy style.
- Enjoy time to shop for souvenirs, such as personalized designs or greeting cards, the purchase of which directly benefits local women.

Return to Amman and spend a free evening in the city or add an excursion.

## $\textbf{Petra} \rightarrow 2 \text{ nights}$

#### Day 5: Petra via Madaba & Mount Nebo

Included meals: breakfast, dinner Today, further explore the history and culture of Jordan on guided tours before continuing on to Petra.

- Tour Madaba, a market town known for its collection of Byzantine-era mosaics.
- Visit St. George's Church and view the sixthcentury mosaic Madaba Map displayed there; discovered by builders at the St. George's church construction site in the 1880s, the Byzantine-era map is the oldest surviving mosaic map of Palestine and is said to have originally comprised more than two million pieces.
- Stop at Mount Nebo—Moses' burial site and the spot from where it's said he saw the Promised Land.
- Enter a mosaic factory and enjoy a hands-on demonstration, during which you'll learn the art of crafting mosaics.
- Head to the Bani Hamida Women's Cooperative, a weaving center whose traditional handicrafts include carpets and baskets made by local women.
- Learn about the cooperative's mission, meet some of the women it supports, and enjoy time to shop for gifts and souvenirs.

Continue to Petra and sit down for an included dinner.

#### Day 6: Sightseeing tour of Petra

Included meals: breakfast

Head to the city of Petra, which was carved into the soft, red rocks of Mount Hor in the third century BC by members of an Arab tribe known as the Nabataeans. Explore the sandstone city alongside your Tour Director.

• Learn about Petra's unique architecture—one of the reasons it was named to the list of modern world wonders.

- Walk through the UNESCO World Heritage Site to the famous Al-Khazneh, or Treasury, which served as a tomb and features one of the most famous facades in the world.
- Take in the intricately carved pillars and columns of the Palace Tomb, whose facade towers fives stories above the ground.
- Stroll through the winding, high-walled gorge known as the Siq and learn how tectonic forces formed the giant crack in the rock.

Please note: In order to enter Petra, customers should be able to walk two miles round-trip in hot weather over uneven terrain. Other modes of transportation may be available for you to book upon your arrival at an additional cost. Spend a free evening in Petra or add an excursion.

# Day 7: Wadi Rum desert safari, Zarb dinner & stargazing

Included meals: breakfast, tasting, dinner, lunch Drive to Wadi Rum, an area in southern Jordan that's known as the Valley of the Moon thanks to its varied desert landscape of natural arches, narrow gorges, towering cliffs, massive landslides, and other features. It's also home to thousands of petroglyphs and archaeological remains. Today, explore it all on a desert safari alongside a local Bedouin guide.

- Sit down for a buffet lunch at an airconditioned, desert bubble camp.
- Take a Jeep ride to a red sand dune, and set off on an optional walk to view ancient rock carvings.
- Stop at a Bedouin tent to learn about the traditions of this ethnic group, largely regarded as Jordan's first inhabitants, and enjoy Arabic coffee.

This evening, enjoy a traditional Bedouin Zarb dinner that's cooked in a pot underground. Afterwards, meet up with a professional astronomer in a desert observatory, where you'll get a chance to explore the night sky and view constellations, galaxies, nebulae, planets, and moons.

**Day 8: Transfer to the Dead Sea** Included meals: breakfast, lunch, farewell dinner Drive north along the Jordan Valley, stopping in the small town of Gawr al-Mazraah at the Al Numeira Environmental Association.

- Learn about Al Numeira, a Jordanian nonprofit working to educate Jordanians on water conservation practices, rural development, and sustainable tourism.
- Meet with an Al Numeira representative to learn about the organization's work and its mission.
- Enjoy an included traditional Jordanian lunch prepared by Al Numeira staff.

Then, travel to the Jordanian side of the Dead Sea and celebrate your trip with your fellow group members at tonight's farewell dinner.

#### Day 9: Free day at the Dead Sea & transfer to Amman

Included meals: breakfast

This morning, float in the famously salty waters of the Dead Sea, located at the lowest point on Earth. Enjoy free time to relax on the beach and swim.

Then, relax in a dayroom before transferring to Amman for your early morning flight home. Please note: Return flights home depart during the early morning, typically between 1am and 6am on day 10.

Dubai may be known as a playground for the world's rich and famous, but this buzzy city in the United Arab Emirates has plenty of historical charm and traditions to offer, too. Get to know both sides of the city, from its sleek and sparkling skyscrapers to its bustling, nothing-you-can'tbuy-there souk. With Dubai as your base, take a day trip to neighboring Abu Dhabi for a peek inside an ancient sporting tradition and to soak up the Emirate's irresistibly modern energy.

#### Day 9: Transfer to Amman & flight to Dubai

Included meals: breakfast Travel back to Amman before boarding your flight to Dubai in the United Arab Emirates.

#### Day 10: Sightseeing tour of Dubai

Included meals: breakfast, lunch Spend the day getting to know both the traditional and ultramodern sides of Dubai, the most populous city in the United Arab Emirates. Join a local guide for a tour of the city, which is known for its glittering skyscrapers, lavish creature comforts, and sun-kissed beaches.

- Walk through the Dubai souk, a traditional marketplace whose vendors sell everything from jewelry to textiles.
- Hop aboard an abra, a traditional water taxi, for a cruise along Dubai Creek—the city's historic commercial hub.
- Get a taste of Emirati cuisine during lunch at the Sheikh Mohammed Centre for Cultural Understanding.
- Drive down Sheikh Zayed Road to New Dubai and admire the 163-story Burj Khalifa—a mixed-use skyscraper and the world's tallest building.
- Travel along the coast, stopping to snap photos of the iconic, sail-shaped Burj Al Arab hotel and the man-made island of Palm Jumeirah.

Enjoy a free evening in Dubai or add an excursion.

#### Day 11: Sightseeing tour of Abu Dhabi

Included meals: breakfast

Spend the day in Abu Dhabi, the largest of seven emirates and the capital of the United Arab Emirates. Made up of 200 islands, Abu Dhabi features a variety of landscapes, ranging from coastal islands to vast desert.

- Stop at the Abu Dhabi Falcon Hospital to learn about falcon rehabilitation efforts and to enjoy a demonstration of the ancient hunting technique of falconry.
- Pass by Saadiyat Island cultural district—home to cultural and architectural gems such as the Louvre Abu Dhabi and the upcoming Guggenheim Abu Dhabi—on a sightseeing tour with a local guide.
- Pass the Emirates Palace and the Corniche, a five-mile waterfront walkway offering incredible views of the Persian Gulf.
- Enter the Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque, one of the largest in the world, and marvel at its detailed marble work and magnificent interiors.

Return to Dubai and enjoy a free evening.

#### Day 12: Free day in Dubai

Included meals: breakfast, farewell dinner Enjoy a free day in Dubai or add an excursion. Tonight, celebrate your trip with your fellow travelers at a farewell dinner served with beer or wine.

#### Day 4: Jordanian Cooking Class & Dinner

to departure.

\$79 (3 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included) Head to the Jabal Al Weibdeh neighborhood this evening and gather with your fellow travelers at a local cooking school housed in its owners' Teta's, or grandmother's, home. Here, you'll meet with a chef and learn how to craft classic dishes, which could include maqluba, a meat, vegetable, and rice dish that's flipped upside down when served, followed by knafeh, a semolina-based dessert. When you're finished cooking, sit down to enjoy the feast that you've made together. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.

#### Day 6: Petra by Night

\$55/\$65\* (2.5 hours, departs in the evening) Tonight, return to the Old City of Petra, where you'll look on in wonder as 1,500 candles illuminate the redrock city. While at the site, you'll enjoy a short walking tour to view the Siq gorge, the Treasury, and other iconic sites bathed in glowing candlelight. Plus, enjoy a sound and light show at the Treasury building, as well as storytelling and local music.

#### **Extension excursion options**

#### Day 10: Burj Khalifa Observation Deck & Dinner

\$159 (4 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included )

Get an unparalleled look at the city of Dubai from the Burj Khalifa, the tallest tower in the world. Soak in the view from observation decks on the 124th and 125th stories, and learn about the engineering and architectural prowess it took to build the Burj Khalifa. Then, head back to ground level to enjoy a walk along the Dubai Mall fountains, followed by dinner. Please note: In accordance with local laws, alcoholic beverages cannot be served at your meal. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.

#### Day 12: A Day in Oman

\$225 (12 hours, departs in the morning) Filled with rich history and stunning landscapes, Oman stands out among its often flashier neighbors because of its long-standing traditions. Travel along the scenic coast, which overlooks the Gulf of Arabia and the Straits of Hormuz, to arrive in Oman's Musandam region. Discover the charming coastal villages of Nadifi, Qanaha, Maglab, and Seebi along Khasab Harbor while cruising through the scenic, tranquil Khor Sham fjord aboard a traditional Omani dhow. Enjoy free time for swimming and snorkeling in the calm waters when you anchor off off Telegraph Island and Seebi Island, Enjoy an included lunch aboard the boat, and keep an eye out for dolphins and other marine animals as you cruise back to your dock in Khasab Harbor. Please note: Snorkeling equipment and towels will be provided onboard the boat. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior
