Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to London today.

London → 3 nights

Day 2: Arrival in London

Included meals: welcome dinner

Welcome to England! Meet your Tour Director and fellow travelers at tonight's welcome dinner.

Day 3: Sightseeing tour of London

Included meals: breakfast

View the regal landmarks of England's vibrant and cosmopolitan capital on a guided sightseeing tour.

- Pass the grand Trafalgar Square and Baroque-style St. Paul's Cathedral, perched atop Ludgate Hill.
- See Westminster Abbey, the setting for royal coronations, weddings, and funerals.
- View icons like Big Ben, the London Eye, Tower Bridge, and the UNESCO-recognized Tower of London.
- Stop by Buckingham Palace, where you may catch the Changing of the Guard.

Day 4: Free day in London

Normandy Coast → 2 nights

Day 5: Normandy Coast via Lille & Honfleur Region

Included meals: breakfast, tasting

Board the famed, high-speed Eurostar train and ride beneath the English Channel as you journey to Lille, France. Then, travel through historic cities and pristine port towns on your way to the Normandy coast.

Please note: Depending on train schedules, you may have a connection in Paris.

- Enjoy a tasting of Calvados, the region's distinctive apple brandy, with local cheese.
- See the untouched Honfleur harbor, once an important port.

Please note: Portage is not included for the train transfers. Travelers must be comfortable lifting and carrying all luggage over steps, onto platforms, and into luggage storage

Day 6: Sightseeing tour of Normandy

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Dive into World War II history with your Tour Director during a visit to Normandy, where the Allied troops landed in June, 1944.

- Travel to the American Cemetery in Colleville-sur-Mer, the burial place for more than 9,000 American soldiers who lost their lives during the Battle of Normandy.
- Walk along Omaha Beach, the landing site of American troops on D-Day.
- Visit Pointe du Hoc to view the granite monument that honors the American 2nd Ranger Battalion, which seized German cannons here before they could be used to fire on American troops.
- Stop in the seaside town of Arromanches, home to one of the main Allied landing harbors, and enjoy free time to explore.
- Pay a visit to Juno Beach and the Bény-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery (*time-permitting*).

Sit down for an included dinner this evening.

Brittany Region → 2 nights

Day 7: Brittany Region via Bayeux & Mont-Saint-Michel

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Travel to the Brittany region today, making several stops en route.

- Visit the Bayeux Museum to view the famed Bayeux Tapestry.
- Explore the striking 8th-century island monastery of Mont-Saint-Michel on a guided sightseeing tour.
- See how the UNESCO World Heritage-recognized monastery, perched high on a granite rock, is surrounded by water at high tide and quicksand at low tide.

- View the Benedictine Abbey of Mont-Saint-Michel with your local guide.

Then, continue your journey towards the Brittany region and sit down for an included dinner.

Day 8: Sightseeing tour of Saint-Malo

Included meals: breakfast

See Saint-Malo's narrow streets, tall granite homes, and medieval ramparts on a guided walking tour.

- Walk along the old walls of the port city, which was once home to many privateers.
- View the burial site of the French writer Chateaubriand on the tidal island of Grand Bé.

Enjoy a free afternoon in the Brittany region or add an excursion.

Day 9: Paris via Chartres

Included meals: breakfast

Travel through the French countryside to Paris today, stopping en route to visit the town of Chartres.

- Enter the impressive Chartres Cathedral, a UNESCO World Heritage site.
- Explore the surrounding square and medieval houses that line the streets of the old city on your own.

Later, arrive in Paris and enjoy a free evening or add an excursion.

Day 10: Sightseeing tour of Paris

Included meals: breakfast

A guided tour introduces you to the architecture, scenery, and history of the City of Light's many neighborhoods, called *arrondissements*.

- Drive down the sycamore-lined Champs-Élysées to view the Arc de Triomphe.
- Pass Pont Neuf and the legendary Notre-Dame Cathedral, located on an island in the Seine River.
- See the Eiffel Tower, the Palais Garnier opera house, and Place de la Concorde, the city's grandest square.

- Marvel at the iconic architecture of the Louvre and Hôtel des Invalides.

Spend a free afternoon in Paris or add an excursion.

Day 3: Windsor Castle

\$125 (5 hours, departs in the afternoon)

Led by a Blue Badge Guide, you'll travel to Windsor for a guided tour of the world's largest and longest-inhabited castle. Founded by William the Conqueror in 1070, Windsor has been the British Royal Family's preferred retreat for the past 900 years. Step inside the State Apartments and St. George's Chapel, where knighting ceremonies of the Most Noble Order of the Garter take place. View the exhibit of royal treasures within the castle. You'll then have time to stroll through the town of Windsor and have a look at Eton College, a prestigious prep school attended by Princes William and Harry. Please note: When the Windsor Castle excursion falls on a Wednesday, entrance will be replaced by an excursion to Hampton Court. For any departures where the Windsor Castle excursion falls on a Tuesday, the excursion will be moved to another day on tour or cancelled. Additionally, St. George's Chapel is closed to the public on Sundays. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.

Day 4: Stonehenge & Oxford

\$145 (9.5 hours, departs in the morning)

Pay a visit to Oxford, home to one of the most prestigious universities in the world. You'll admire the charming city's spire-studded architecture and learn more about its academic legacy during a visit to New College at Oxford University. Founded in the 14th century, this college is one of the oldest institutions in the city, and you'll discover its extensive history during your visit. Then, enjoy free time for lunch before continuing on to Stonehenge, perhaps England's most mysterious landmark. The origin and purpose of this ring of stones, which dates back an estimated 5,000 years, is unknown, though most believe it was a temple and observatory. Take some time to explore the intriguing stone formations and visit the newly opened exhibition and visitor center before heading back to London. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.

Day 8: Brittany's Emerald Coast & Cancale Lunch

\$125/\$135* (5.5, departs in the morning)

Admire stunning ocean views as you take a short drive along the Brittany region's Emerald Coast toward Cancale. This small fishing town has earned a reputation as the region's oyster capital due to the world-famous Breton oysters it produces, and you'll learn all about the production during a visit to a nearby oyster farm with a local guide. Sip a glass of wine as you taste three types of oysters pulled from the surrounding waters. Then, continue on to Cancale to taste more local specialties during an included lunch at a French restaurant known as a crêperie. Spend free time exploring the town before making your way back to Saint Malo. Please note: This excursion is seasonal and runs from January through November.

Day 9: Dinner in Paris & Seine River Cruise

\$129/\$139* (5 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Take in the nighttime allure of the City of Light on a special evening excursion. The event begins with dinner at a local restaurant. After you dine, board a boat cruise along the Seine. As you coast along the river and under Paris' bridges, you'll behold the illuminated monuments of the city glittering alongside the riverbanks. Please note: The dress code may vary depending on the restaurant for your dinner. Your Tour Director will advise you on what to wear, but shorts and sneakers are likely to be considered inappropriate attire.

Day 10: Versailles Palace & Gardens

\$139 (5 hours, departure time varies)

The reign of Louis XIV, known as the "Sun King," set new standards for decadence among the crowned heads of Europe. It took 50 years and 35,000 workers to turn Versailles, once a small hunting lodge, into the most magnificent château in all of France and the envy of royalty worldwide. On this excursion, you'll see the palace in all its glory as you tour the State Apartments and the glittering Hall of Mirrors. Then, stroll through the lavish gardens to admire their fine statuary, splendid fountains, and colorful flowerbeds. Please note: Versailles Palace is closed on Mondays. The optional excursion may be moved to a different day on tour to accommodate schedules. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 45 days prior to departure.

Day 11: Monet & the Landscapes of Giverny

\$109/\$119* (6 hours, departs in the morning)

The village of Giverny was home to Claude Monet from 1883 until his death in 1926. On a visit to Monet's home and gardens, discover the subtle palette of colors that inspired his Water Lilies series and gave rise to a new way of seeing. Please note: This excursion is seasonal and runs from April through October.

Extension excursion options

Day 12: Food of Paris Walking Tour

\$109 (2.5 hours, departs in the morning)

Meet up with a local guide for a culinary-themed walking tour through Le Marais. This chic district is located on the Right Bank of the Seine and is home to some of the city's best boutiques, cocktail bars, and restaurants. You'll walk through Marché des Enfants Rouges, the city's oldest covered market, stopping to sample fresh fruit, cheese, and crepes. Then, watch locals go about their daily lives as you stroll along the charming cafe-lined streets. Your guide will talk about the various flavors and cooking techniques that have come to define French cuisine as you taste fresh pastries and macaroons at local shops. After your tour ends, opt to stay in the area where you can shop and eat lunch or travel back to your hotel. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at

least 20 days prior to departure.

Day 13: Paris Home-Hosted Dinner

\$95 (3 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Join a local at their home in Paris to enjoy traditional dishes and dine like a true Parisian. During this dinner, you'll receive an authentic understanding of your host's day-to-day life while learning about French culture and traditions from a new perspective. Please note: Your Tour Director will not attend this excursion. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.
