Overnight Flight → 1 night

Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Palermo today.

Palermo → 2 nights

Day 2: Arrival in Palermo

Included meals: dinner

Welcome to Italy! Settle in to your hotel. Then, gather with your Tour Director and fellow group members at a mixer before enjoying a welcome dinner.

Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Palermo & Monreale

Included meals: breakfast

This morning, embark on a guided tour of the bayside city of Palermo and the hilltop town of Monreale.

- Visit the architecturally diverse Palermo Cathedral and see the stunning artwork of the Cappella Palatina
- Head to nearby Monreale and enter Monreale Cathedral, a UNESCO World Heritage site that combines Norman, Arab, and Byzantine architectural styles

Spend a free afternoon in Palermo or add an excursion.

Syracuse → 2 nights

Day 4: Syracuse via Piazza Armerina

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

On the way to Syracuse, stop for a guided tour of Piazza Armerina and view the stunning mosaics in the UNESCO-listed Villa Romana del Casale.

After, continue on to Syracuse and sit down for an included dinner.

Day 5: Sightseeing tour of Syracuse & cooking class

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Embark on a guided tour of Syracuse, a city known for its rich Greek history.

- Visit the Greek theater, the most complete ancient Greek theater still in existence

- Tour the massive Paradise Quarry and gardens, featuring the cave that Caravaggio dubbed “The Ear of Dionysius” for its unique acoustics
- Visit the Roman amphitheater, then cross a bridge to the Island of Ortygia to see the Temple of Apollo and Syracuse Cathedral

This afternoon, craft an authentic Sicilian meal alongside a professional chef during a hands-on cooking class. Learn some tips and techniques before enjoying your creations during an included dinner with wine.

Taormina → 2 nights

Day 6: Transfer to Taormina & sightseeing tour

Included meals: breakfast

Transfer to Taormina, where a local guide introduces you to this scenic town perched high above the sea.

- Stroll along the city’s cobblestone streets to see Taormina Cathedral and Palazzo Corvaja, seat of the first Sicilian parliament
- Visit the town’s 2nd-century Greek theater which, on clear days, offers panoramic vistas of Mount Etna

Day 7: Free day in Taormina

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Spend a free day in Taormina or add an excursion.

Celebrate your trip at a farewell dinner featuring live music played by local musicians this evening.

Flight Home

Day 8: Departure

Transfer to the Catania airport for your flight home or continue on to explore Rome.

Rome → 3 nights

Day 8: Flight to Rome

Included meals: breakfast

Fly to Rome and spend a free evening in the Italian capital on your own.

Day 9: Sightseeing tour of Rome

Included meals: breakfast

Follow in the footsteps of the ancient Romans on a guided tour of the Eternal City.

- Soak up over 2,000 years of history in Imperial Rome, viewing the Arch of Constantine and the Arch of Titus
- Enter the Colosseum, the largest amphitheater of the Roman Empire
- Stop at the ruins of the Forum, once the setting of parades, elections, and trials
- Pass by Palatine Hill to see Circus Maximus, the stadium where ancient Romans raced chariots, and the Baths of Caracalla

Day 3: Ancient Ruins of Segesta

\$85/\$95* (5 hours, departs in the afternoon)

Journey west from Palermo to visit the ancient ruins of Segesta. During the guided tour, you'll learn about the indigenous Elymians who lived in western Sicily throughout the Bronze Age. View the magnificent fifth-century Doric temple and ancient Greek-style theater that they built as you soak in views of the picturesque Sicilian countryside.

Day 7: Museo Storico dello Sbarco & Historic Catania

\$65/\$75* (6 hours, departs in the morning)

Explore Sicily's World War II history on a visit to the Museo Storico dello Sbarco, an interactive museum featuring striking photographs and a life-size model of a war-era bunker. Then, stroll past the Baroque architecture of Catania's historic center, a UNESCO World Heritage site. You'll see the bustling shops and cafes of Via Etnea and Via dei Crociferi, the grand Teatro Massimo Bellini and the historic Palazzo Biscari. End your tour at the beautiful Piazza del Duomo, home of the famous elephant statue, where you'll have free time for lunch.

Michelangelo. Masterpieces await at every turn, from Bernini's magnificent bronze canopy to Michelangelo's Pietà.

Please note: Should this excursion fall on a Sunday, it'll be moved to another day of the tour. Backpacks aren't allowed in the Vatican, and shorts and sleeveless shirts are strictly prohibited. Due to closures of certain entrances and pathways, wait times may extend to several hours during busy travel months. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 70 days prior to departure.

Day 10: Pasta-Making Class & Dinner

\$119/\$129* (4 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

In this hands-on cooking class led by an experienced Italian chef, you'll learn to make pasta—perhaps pillowy ravioli or castellane, a ridged shell pasta that's rolled into a long, oval shape—using traditional techniques you can keep on practicing when you get back home. Then, sit down for dinner and enjoy the dishes you've prepared, along with wine.

Extension excursion options

Day 9: Ancient Rome: St. Paul's Basilica & the Catacombs

\$89/\$99* (4 hours, departure time varies)

Descend into Rome's ancient catacombs, where early Christians buried saints and popes alongside commoners. A local guide will lead you through the burial chambers before your visit to St. Paul's Basilica, one of the four most important basilicas of Rome. Originally founded by Constantine the Great, the Basilica also houses the tomb of St. Paul.

Please note: Shorts and sleeveless shirts are not permitted within the Basilica. Also, this excursion involves extensive walking and may be challenging for claustrophobic travelers.

Day 10: Iconic Sights: Vatican City

\$125 (3.5 hours, departure time varies)

This guided tour takes you inside Vatican City—a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the most sacred places in Christendom. This independent city-state within Rome serves as the headquarters of the Roman Catholic Church and is home to the Pope. Upon arrival, turn on your pre-distributed headset and dive into the Vatican's rich history with your local guide. First, visit the Vatican Museums, which are more than 500 years old and house many of the world's most important Classical- and Renaissance-era sculptures. Next, step inside the Sistine Chapel, whose frescoed ceiling is arguably Michelangelo's greatest masterpiece. Finally, pay a visit to the enormous St. Peter's Basilica, the epicenter of the Roman Catholic faith. The artists who have contributed to its glory are some of the best Italy has ever known: Bramante, Peruzzi, Raphael, and
