### Day 2: Arrival in Palermo

# Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Palermo & Monreale

This morning, embark on a guided tour of the bayside city of Palermo and the hilltop town of Monreale.

- Discover the city's Baroque architecture as you pass the Quattro Canti piazza in the historic center
- Step inside the Cappella Palatina to see the stunning mosaics and artwork
- Head to nearby Monreale and enter Monreale Cathedral, a UNESCO World Heritage site that combines Norman, Arab, and Byzantine architectural styles

# Syracuse → 2 nights

# Day 4: Syracuse via Piazza Armerina

Included meals: breakfast, dinner
On the way to Syracuse, stop for a guided tour
of Piazza Armerina and view the stunning
mosaics in the UNESCO-listed Villa Romana del
Casale.

After, continue on to Syracuse and sit down for an included dinner.

## Day 5: Sightseeing tour of Syracuse

Included meals: breakfast
Embark on a guided tour of Syracuse, a city
known for its rich Greek history.

- Visit the Greek theater, the most complete ancient Greek theater still in existence
- Tour the massive Paradise Quarry and gardens, featuring the cave that Caravaggio dubbed "The Ear of Dionysius" for its unique acoustics
- Visit the Roman amphitheater, then cross a bridge to the Island of Ortygia to see the Temple of Apollo and Syracuse Cathedral

# Day 6: Transfer to Taormina & sightseeing tour

Included meals: breakfast

Transfer to Taormina, where a local guide introduces you to this scenic town perched high above the sea.

- Stroll along the city's cobblestone streets to see Taormina Cathedral and Palazzo Corvaja, seat of the first Sicilian parliament
- Visit the town's 2nd-century Greek theater which, on clear days, offers panoramic vistas of Mount Etna

- Pass by Palatine Hill to see Circus Maximus, the stadium where ancient Romans raced chariots, and the Baths of Caracalla

## Day 3: Cefalù Wine Tasting & Lunch

\$125/\$135\* (7 hours, departs in the afternoon, lunch included)

Travel to Cefalù, a seaside jewel on the northern coast of Sicily. Along the way, stop to indulge in a wine tasting paired with a delicious lunch featuring regional cuisine inspired by fresh, seasonal ingredients and learn more about the varietals grown on the vineyard. Continue on a scenic coastal drive to Cefalù and enjoy free time to visit its cathedral. Built for Roger II in 1311 and features stunning examples of Arab-Norman architecture.

Afterwards, just take it easy and get swept up in the laid-back, charming town—stroll the winding alleys, admire the unique medieval architecture, peruse some local craftwork, or just relax on the gorgeous, sandy beaches the area is known for.

#### Day 5: Baroque City of Noto

\$65/\$75\* (5 hours, departs in the afternoon)
Spend the afternoon in Noto, a quaint city at the foot of the Hyblaean Mountains. Noto has a multidimensional culture that ties back to Greek, Roman, Arabic, and Norman influence. A local guide gives you the lay of the land, highlighting the UNESCO-recognized cathedral, Palazzo Nicolaci di Villadorata, and the city's Baroque style architecture. As you stroll down Corso Vittorio Emanuele, the main street, you'll sample Sicilian chocolate and pastries. Then, enjoy free time to explore.

# Day 7: Sicilian Cooking Class & Lunch

\$129/\$139\* (4 hours, departs in the morning, lunch included)

Make your way outside of Taormina to take part in a hands-on cooking class led by an experienced Sicilian chef. The island's cuisine draws on the flavors prevalent in Spanish, Arab, and Greek foods. You'll learn how to make traditional Sicilian recipes, and pick up some culinary tips and tricks along the way. Then, sit down to enjoy the lunch you crafted with locally produced wines.

# Day 8: Hidden Sicily: Medieval Savoca & Forza d'Agrò

\$65/\$75\* (4 hours, departs in the morning)

Delve into the traditional Sicilian villages that served as sets for Francis Ford Coppola's "The Godfather." First, visit Savoca and tour the Church of St. Lucia and the Bar Vitelli. Walk through this medieval village and marvel at its 15th-century buildings and panoramic views of the Mediterranean sea. Continue on to Forza d'Agrò, another "hidden" Sicilian village, where you'll visit the Church of the Annunciation. Please note: The order of villages visited is subject to change. In the event that the Church of the Annunciation is closed, it may only be viewed from the outside. Please note: the visit to Forza d'Agrò is weather dependent, due to safety.

### **Extension excursion options**

# Day 10: Ancient Rome: St. Paul's Basilica & the Catacombs

\$89/\$99\* (4 hours, departure time varies)
Descend into Rome's ancient catacombs, where early
Christians buried saints and popes alongside
commoners. A local guide will lead you through the
burial chambers before your visit to St. Paul's Basilica,
one of the four most important basilicas of Rome.
Originally founded by Constantine the Great, the
Basilica also houses the tomb of St. Paul.
Please note: Shorts and sleeveless shirts are not
permitted within the Basilica. Also, this excursion
involves extensive walking and may be challenging for
claustrophobic travelers.

#### Day 11: Iconic Sights: Vatican City

\$125 (3.5 hours, departure time varies) This guided tour takes you inside Vatican City—a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the most sacred places in Christendom. This independent citystate within Rome serves as the headquarters of the Roman Catholic Church and is home to the Pope. Upon arrival, turn on your pre-distributed headset and dive into the Vatican's rich history with your local guide. First, visit the Vatican Museums, which are more than 500 years old and house many of the world's most important Classical- and Renaissance-era sculptures. Next, step inside the Sistine Chapel, whose frescoed ceiling is arguably Michelangelo's greatest masterpiece. Finally, pay a visit to the enormous St. Peter's Basilica, the epicenter of the Roman Catholic faith. The artists who have contributed to its glory are some of the best Italy has ever known: Bramante, Peruzzi, Raphael, and Michelangelo. Masterpieces await at every turn, from Bernini's magnificent bronze canopy to Michelangelo's

Please note: Should this excursion fall on a Sunday, it'll be moved to another day of the tour. Backpacks aren't allowed in the Vatican, and shorts and sleeveless shirts are strictly prohibited. Due to closures of certain entrances and pathways, wait times may extend to several hours during busy travel months. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 70 days prior to departure.

# Day 11: Pasta-Making Class & Dinner

\$119/\$129\* (4 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

In this hands-on cooking class led by an experienced Italian chef, you'll learn to make pasta—perhaps pillowy ravioli or castellane, a ridged shell pasta that's rolled into a long, oval shape—using traditional techniques you can keep on practicing when you get back home. Then, sit down for dinner and enjoy the dishes you've prepared, along with wine.
