Overnight Flight → 1 night

Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Paris today.

Paris → 2 nights

Day 2: Arrival in Paris

Included meals: welcome dinner

Get acquainted with Paris before meeting your Tour Director and fellow travelers at a welcome dinner.

Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Paris

Included meals: breakfast

A guided sightseeing tour introduces you to the architecture, scenery and cuisine of the City of Light's many neighborhoods, called *arrondissements*.

- Drive down the Champs-Élysées to view the Arc de Triomphe
- Pass the legendary Notre-Dame Cathedral, on an island in the Seine River
- See the Eiffel Tower, the Palais Garnier opera house and Place de la Concorde
- Marvel at the eclectic and iconic architecture of the Louvre
- Sample traditional French pastries and cheeses on a culinary walk

Enjoy a free evening or add an excursion.

Champagne Region → 2 nights

Day 4: Reims via Chantilly

Included meals: breakfast, lunch

On your way to Reims, part of the famous Champagne region, stop in Chantilly for a tour of the magnificent château and taste of the town's famous vanilla whipped cream.

Day 5: Sightseeing tour of Reims

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Explore Reims, home to the world's most renowned Champagne estates.

- Visit the Gothic-style Reims Cathedral, a UNESCO-recognized site

- Step inside the Basilica of Saint-Rémi, the oldest church in Reims
 - Pass by the Palace of Tau, a palatial 13th-century Gothic chapel and hall
 - Tour one of the most reputed wine cellars in Champagne, where you'll enjoy a tasting of the famous bubbly

Burgundy Region → 2 nights

Day 6: Dijon via Troyes & Chablis

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Travel through the world-famous Burgundy region.

- Stop in the medieval town of Troyes to admire the unique architecture on a walking tour, followed by free time for lunch
- Visit Chablis, the center of Burgundy's winemaking heritage
- Enjoy a Chablis tasting paired with a charcuterie board of meats and cheeses

Arrive in Dijon, home of the famed mustard, for an included group dinner.

Day 7: Sightseeing tour of Dijon

Included meals: breakfast, lunch

Soak in Dijon's sights and sample its fare on a guided tour.

- Stop at the Palace of the Dukes and Estates of Burgundy
- Take in the Church of Notre-Dame de Dijon and Dijon's medieval streets
- At lunch, feast on boeuf bourguignon, a classic French dish

Enjoy a free afternoon or add an excursion.

Lyon → 3 nights

Day 8: Lyon via the Burgundy & Beaujolais Regions

Included meals: breakfast

Make your way to Lyon, the gourmet capital of France, with a few stops along the way.

- Journey to the Burgundy region where you'll take a tour of the Château de Cormatin, an elegant private castle surrounded by a moat and formal gardens
- Visit nearby Tournus to see the town's Benedictine abbey
- Stop in the Beaujolais region to taste some of the area's rustic red wines

Day 9: Sightseeing tour of Lyon

Included meals: breakfast

A local guide introduces you to the country's culinary capital on a sightseeing tour.

- Take in the Gothic and Renaissance architecture as you pass by the Basilica of Notre-Dame de Fourvière
- See Lyon Cathedral and walk through centuries-old *traboules*, or underground passages
- End your tour in the city's famous indoor market, Halles de Lyon
- Learn the French art of pastry-making during a cooking lesson with local chefs

Day 10: Free day in Lyon

Included meals: breakfast, farewell dinner

Spend the day exploring on your own or add an excursion. Later, say goodbye to your fellow travelers during a farewell dinner at a traditional *bouchon* restaurant.

Day 11: Departure

Day 11: Travel to Aix-en-Provence

Included meals: breakfast

Take the high-speed TGV train to Aix-en-Provence, and enjoy a free afternoon or add an excursion.

Day 12: Sightseeing tour of Aix-en-Provence

Included meals: breakfast

Embark on a guided walking tour of the city to uncover the quintessential charms of Southern France.

- Discover Aix's beautiful boulevards, the intricate medieval cathedral and enter the former studio of Cézanne
- Depending on the season, your tour may end with a stroll through the city's vibrant markets to admire fresh flowers, sample the region's famous herbs and seek out *calisson*, a traditional Provençal candy

Day 13: Free day in Aix-en-Provence

Included meals: breakfast

Spend the day exploring on your own or add an excursion.

This evening, enjoy a farewell drink as you celebrate your trip with your fellow group members.

Day 14: Departure

Day 3: Dinner in Paris & Seine River Cruise

\$129/\$139* (5 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Take in the nighttime allure of the City of Light on a special evening excursion. The event begins with dinner at a local restaurant. After you dine, board a boat cruise along the Seine. As you coast along the river and under Paris' bridges, you'll behold the illuminated monuments of the city glittering alongside the riverbanks. Please note: The dress code may vary depending on the restaurant for your dinner. Your Tour Director will advise you on what to wear, but shorts and sneakers are likely to be considered inappropriate attire.

Spend a day on France's stunning Mediterranean coast. Your excursion starts in bustling Marseille, where a local guide shows the diverse character of the city. Notre-Dame de la Garde, the artsy quarter of Le Panier and the Old Port highlight Marseille's rich heritage, while visits to the Euroméditerranée district and the Palais Omnisports show its more modern appeal. After your tour, sit down for an included lunch and get a taste for Marseille's fresh, flavorful cuisine. In the afternoon, head to nearby Cassis for a scenic boat ride around the dramatic cliffs and calanques that have made this French Riviera city famous.

Day 7: Historic Beaune & Burgundy Cellars

\$79/\$89* (5 hours, departs in the afternoon)

Nicolas Rolin, the Duke of Burgundy's chancellor, built the Hospices de Beaune in the hope that his good works would earn him a place in heaven. With his wife, Guigone de Salins, Rolin devoted much of his fortune to caring for the thousands who were left poor and starving after the Hundred Years' War. Nearly 600 years later, income from the town's vineyards along with profits from annual wine auctions continue to fund the organization. You'll tour the Hospices before enjoying a wine tasting in Beaune's Patriarche wine cellars.

Day 10: Medieval Village of Pérouges

\$69 (4 hours, departs in the afternoon)

Make your way to the charming village of Pérouges, a favorite among the French for its winding cobblestone streets and medieval architecture. Visit the central Place du Tilleul for a panoramic view of the area and explore the fortress-church of Sainte Marie Madeleine. After taking in the scenery, stop at a local bakery to sample some of the region's sweetest specialties. Taste a galette—a round, flat tart filled with berries—and hypocras, a spiced wine flavored with honey, ginger, and cinnamon. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.

Extension excursion options

Day 11: Provençal Dinner & Wine Tasting

\$135/\$145* (6 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Travel to a rustic Provençal village outside of Aix-en-Provence. Start your evening with a tasting of red, white, and rosé wines at a vineyard and learn how each one is produced. Then, enjoy dinner at a local restaurant featuring the traditional herb-accented Provençal dishes, which the region is known for.

Day 13: Marseille & Cassis: Coastal Cuisine & Cruise

\$149/\$159* (8 hours, departs in the morning with lunch)
