Overnight Flight → 1 night

Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Santiago today.

Santiago → 3 nights

Day 2: Arrival in Santiago

Included meals: welcome lunch
Welcome to Chile! Gather with your fellow
travelers at a local restaurant for a welcome
lunch.

Day 3: Food Sightseeing tour of Santiago

Included meals: breakfast, tasting
Set out to explore Santiago with a local guide on a sightseeing tour.

- Drive through the city's Barrio Bellavista, known for its bohemian charm
- Pass the Barrio Lastarria and the Chilean National Museum of Fine Arts
- Walk up Santa Lucía Hill to soak in incredible views from the spot where Santiago was founded in 1541
- Try mote con huesillos, a popular drink in Chile known for its refreshing peach and cinnamon flavors
- Head to Plaza de Armas where you'll see Santiago Metropolitan Cathedral, the Chilean National History Museum, and the Central Post Office Building
- Visit El Mercado Central, a bustling culinary hotspot, to taste the city's best seafood, wines, and meats

Enjoy a free afternoon in Santiago or add an excursion.

+ Concha & Toro Winery Tour with Lunch

Day 4: Sightseeing tour of Valparaíso & Casablanca Valley wine tasting

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, wine tasting Visit the coastal city of Valparaíso, locally known as The Jewel of the Pacific.

- Embark on a guided tour of the city, passing through the UNESCO-recognized port and historic quarter
- Board the Queen Victoria funicular for a ride up to the hilltop neighborhoods of Cerro Alegre and Cerro Concepción

 Set off on a walking tour of whimsical streets full of colorful houses and imaginative street art

Afterward, make your way to the nearby Casablanca Valley, where you'll stop at a boutique, biodynamic winery for a tasting. Sample the winery's signature Sauvignon Blanc, Pinot Noir, Chardonnay, and Syrah during an included plated lunch, before making your way back to Santiago.

Mendoza \rightarrow 3 nights

Day 5: Mendoza via Aconcagua Valley

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, wine tasting Transfer to Mendoza through the famed Aconcagua Valley, one of Chile's five principal wine regions.

- Enjoy a barbecue lunch paired with Carménère, Pinot Noir, and Cabernet Sauvignon wines at an Aconcagua wine estate
- Pass through the towering Andes mountain range to cross the border to Argentina
- Visit the small villages of Uspallata, Puente del Inca, and Horcones, and stop for breathtaking photos along the way

Then, continue on to Mendoza and enjoy a free evening or add an excursion.

+ Taste of Mendoza: Tapas & Wine Tour

Day 6: Sightseeing tour of Mendoza, cooking class & distillery visit

Included meals: breakfast, tasting, liquor tasting, dinner

Get to know the city of Mendoza on a guided tour.

- Walk through Plaza Independencia to pass Mendoza Cathedral, the Basilica of St.
 Francis, and the former Banco Hipotecario, before arriving in the Civic district
- Sample alfajores, a traditional cookie, and dulce de leche at a local chocolate factory
- Enter General San Martín Park to see the Monument to the Army of the Andes

This evening, visit a local home of a master distiller and chef where you'll learn about

traditional Andean cuisine and the intricate distilling process. Craft your own gin, and see how Argentinians cook with seasonal ingredients and a range of meat cuts. Then, sit down for an included dinner paired with the house wine.

Day 7: Mendoza wine tastings

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, wine tasting Head outside of the city to visit to of the most famous wineries located in the Luján de Cuyo and Maipu regions.

- Learn about the area's wine-making traditions
- Enjoy a lunch of seasonal, local cuisine along with a wine pairing featuring Malbec, the area's signature sip
- Soak in the beautiful views of the vineyards, which sit against the backdrop of the snowcapped Andes mountains

Buenos Aires → 3 nights

Day 8: Flight to Buenos Aires

Included meals: breakfast

This morning fly from Mendoza to Buenos Aires and enjoy a free afternoon or add an excursion.

+ Buenos Aires Tango Lesson, Show & Dinner

Day 9: Food of Buenos Aires tour

Included meals: breakfast, tasting

Taste your way through the city as you embark on a guided tour of the place where tango was born.

- Drive through the aristocratic Retiro and Recoleta neighborhoods to visit the grave of Eva Perón, the former First Lady of Argentina
- Pop in to a traditional bar where historic writers and car enthusiasts used to frequent and enjoy a drink
- Make your way past the National Museum of Fine Arts and the beautiful parks and gardens of Palermo
- Drive along 9 de Julio Avenue, the widest street in the world
- Wander through the famous Mercado San Telmo, where you'll sample traditional Argentinian street foods like empanadas

- Explore the La Boca neighborhood, where the influence of Italian settlers can still be felt today, and taste a traditional appetizer sandwich called choripán
- End your tour with a dulce de leche ice cream treat

Spend a free evening in the city or add an excursion.

+ Argentinian Cultural Dinner

Day 10: Buenos Aires street art & culture

Included meals: breakfast, tasting, farewell dinner

Today, dig in to Buenos Aires' colorful, spirited art scene and visit one of the best opera houses in the world.

- Join your Tour Director for a guided tour of the city's vibrant street art and murals, which capture everything from political unrest to whimsical pets
- Meet artists along the way and learn about the Buenos Aires Street Art Organization, which organizes and curates the murals with international artists
- Step inside the Colón Theater, famous for it's acoustics and architectural details
- Enjoy a tasting of churros, medialunas, and coffee at the iconic Café Tortoni

Tonight, celebrate your trip with your group at an authentic Argentinian asado farewell dinner at a local restaurant. You'll see grill cooking techniques up close, in this intimate dining experience.

Uruguay → 2 nights

Day 11: Montevideo via Colonia del Sacremento

Included meals: breakfast, lunch

This morning, board a ferry to cross the Río de la Plata and make your way to Uruguay. Visit the city of Colonia del Sacramento, where you'll walk through the UNESCO-listed Historic Quarter on a guided sightseeing tour.

- Stroll past the Basílica del Santísimo
 Sacramento, the Real de San Carlos bullring, and the city's famous white lighthouse
- Pass through Mayor Square and take in riverside views from the historic San Pedro Bastion
- Visit a local restaurant for a lunch of Uruguayan specialties and wine

Then, continue on to Montevideo and enjoy a free evening.

Day 12: Sightseeing tour of Montevideo & Canelones wine tastings

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, wine tasting Embark on a guided tour of Montevideo, the southernmost capital in the Americas.

- Stroll through Old Town, passing the renowned Solís Theatre as you go
- See landmarks like the Legislative Palace,
 Presidential House, Centenary Stadium, and
 La Diligencia Monument in Prado's Park
- Stroll through the mouthwatering food stalls at the Mercado del Puerto, once the city's principle meat and produce market
- Get a glimpse of local life as you pass through a few of the city's residential neighborhoods and drive along the beaches on United National Rambla

This afternoon, travel to the Canelones wine region to visit two family-run wineries, or *bodegas*.

- Tour the vineyards and hear how the winemaking traditions are passed down from generation to generation
- Eat lunch at one of the bodegas and learn how the winemakers put their personal stamp on the varietals they create, during tastings served with cheese

This evening, toast to your trip with a farewell drink.

Day 3: Concha & Toro Winery Tour with Lunch

\$149/\$159* (5 hours, departs in the afternoon, includes lunch)

Head just outside of Santiago to the Valle de Maipo for a visit to the renowned Viña Concha y Toro wine estate. Family-run since 1883, it is now one of the most notable wineries in the world. You'll tour the main house, where the family summered for generations. Enjoy wandering through the sprawling park grounds to marvel at the sculpted lake, and stroll along the eucalyptus-lined paths. Then, descend into the cellars and see how the winery stores its legendary wines, before sitting down for an included lunch complete with wine pairings.

Day 5: Taste of Mendoza: Tapas & Wine Tour

\$55/\$65* (4 hours, departs in the evening)

Tapas originated in Spain, when locals began putting a snack on top of (or tapa) their drink. Now, this bite-size dining style is sweeping Mendoza, too. Join your Tour Director for a deep dive into their small plate scene.

Visit a local wine bar and enjoy an informal, light dinner of high-quality tapas dishes paired with local wines.

Continue on to a microbrewery for a taste of the city's craft beers along with more tapas, before returning back to your hotel.

Day 8: Buenos Aires Tango Lesson, Show & Dinner

\$105/\$115* (6 hours , departs in the evening)
Buenos Aires is the birthplaces of Tango, and no trip's complete without feeling the passionate rhythm of this city's streets. So put on your dancing shoes and barrida through a private, exclusive tango lesson. Follow a master tanguero, or tango dancer, as they teach you all the steps, moves, and emotions that go into performing Argentina's national dance. Then, sit down to watch one of Buenos Aires' most renowned tango shows. Lose yourself in the live music, as elegant performers transport you to a bygone era. You'll enjoy a dinner featuring regional specialties, as well as Argentine wine, as the dancers glide toward their final abrazo.

Day 9: Argentinian Cultural Dinner

\$145/\$155* (4 hours, departs in the evening with dinner)

Whip up some of Argentina's signature dishes and learn about the country's food traditions during an interactive and unique dining experience. Start off by learning to make empanadas, a stuffed bread dish, and alfajores cookies. Then, try your hand at preparing mate, a traditional, caffeinated South American drink made from yerba mate leaves. After, sip on unlimited wine during a steak dinner. As you eat, you'll learn about the different cuts of Argentinian meat. At the end of the night, you'll receive the recipes for each of the dishes you made so you can recreate your Argentine meal for friends and family at home.
