Overnight flight → 1 night

Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to London today.

London → 2 nights

Day 2: Arrival in London

Included meals: welcome dinner
Welcome to England! Meet your Tour Director
and fellow travelers at tonight's welcome dinner.

Day 3: Sightseeing tour of London

Included meals: breakfast

View the historical buildings and landmarks of England's vibrant capital on a guided sightseeing tour.

- Step inside the Imperial War Museums to see exhibits focusing on people's experiences during times of war.
- See Westminster Abbey, the setting for royal coronations, weddings, and funerals.
- Pass by Wellington Barracks, headquarters for the British Army's Foot Guards.
- Visit the Churchill War Rooms and explore the secret underground bunker that the Prime Minister and his Cabinet met in during WWII.

Normandy Region → 2 nights

Day 4: Ferry to Normandy Region

Included meals: breakfast

Transfer to Portsmouth and step inside D Day Story Museum. Learn about preparation and execution of Operation Overlord, the Allied invasion of Normandy.

Then, board a ferry and cross the English Channel to the Normandy region in France. Sail along the same waters that the Allied soldiers did prior to the Normandy landings. You'll dock in the Caen before heading to your hotel in the Normandy region.

Day 5: Sightseeing tour of Normandy Region

Included meals: breakfast, dinner
Dive into World War II history alongside your
Tour Director during a visit to Normandy, where
the Allied troops landed in June 1944.

- Travel to the American Cemetery in Colleville-sur-Mer, the burial place for more than 9,000 American soldiers who lost their lives during the Battle of Normandy.
- Walk along Omaha Beach, the landing site of American troops on D-Day.
- Visit Pointe du Hoc to view the granite monument that honors the American 2nd Ranger Battalion, which seized German cannons here before they could be used to fire on American troops.
- Stop in the seaside town of Arromanches, home to one of the main Allied landing harbors, and enjoy free time to explore.

Sit down for an included dinner this evening.

Paris \rightarrow 2 nights

Day 6: Transfer to Paris & sightseeing tour

Included meals: breakfast

Travel to Paris, where a guided tour introduces you to the architecture, scenery, and history of the City of Light's many neighborhoods, called arrondissements.

- Stop to take a photo of the Eiffel Tower.
- See Le Meurice hotel, the Nazi headquarters in Paris.
- Pass the Louvre and the legendary Notre-Dame Cathedral, located on an island in the Seine River.
- See the Paris Police Prefecture and the Mémorial des Martyrs de la Déportation.
- End in Le Marais, the city's Jewish Quarter. Please note: On some departures, the Paris sightseeing tour may be offered on day 7.

Day 7: Free day in Paris

Spend a free day in Paris or add excursions.

Palace & Gardens excursion may be offered on
day 6.

Day 8: Luxembourg via Reims

Included meals: breakfast, dinner
Stop in the French city of Reims and enter the
Musée de la Reddition to see where German
forces surrendered, ending WWII. After, continue
on to Luxembourg and sit down for an included
dinner.

Day 9: Sightseeing tour of Bastogne

Included meals: breakfast
Cross into Belgium and dive into Bastogne's
WWII history on today's guided tour.

- View the General George S. Patton Memorial and the Mardasson Memorial, which was designed to look like the stars on the American flag.
- Visit the Bastogne War Museum and pay tribute to the American soldiers who defended Belgium in WWII during the Battle of the Bulge.

Enjoy a free afternoon in Luxembourg or add an excursion.

Day 10: Cologne via Remagen

Included meals: breakfast, dinner
Cross into Germany and visit the town of
Remagen. You'll view Ludendorff Bridge, which
played a vital role in helping Allied forces cross
the Rhine River and defeat the German forces.
Continue on to Cologne to enter Cologne
Cathedral, a UNESCO-listed Gothic
masterpiece, and enjoy free time to explore the
city before sitting down for an included dinner
this evening.

Day 11: Train to Berlin

Included meals: breakfast
Board a high-speed train and travel to Berlin.
Spend a free evening to explore the city on your

Day 12: Sightseeing tour of Berlin

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

A local guide introduces you to the monuments of Berlin's WWII history as well as the signs of its re-emergence as a vibrant cultural center.

- Discover the Brandenburg Gate, the symbol of a reunited Berlin.
- Walk past the Reichstag building to see where the Parliament of the German Empire met from 1871 to 1918.
- · Pass by the Holocaust Memorial.
- See Hitler's war bunker as well as the Topography of Terror Museum, which marks where the SS and Gestapo were once based.
- View the Detlev-Rohwedder-Haus, former headquarters for the Nazi aviation branch known as the Luftwaffe.

Celebrate your trip with your group at a farewell dinner tonight.

 See the Gestapo Headquarters and the Square of the Victims of National Socialism.

Spend a free day in Munich or add an excursion.
Raise a glass and toast to your trip with a farewell drink this evening.

Join a local guide and set off on a walking tour to discover Munich's WWII history.

- Pass by Sterneckerbräu to see where members of the Nazi party once gathered.
- View the Führerbau and learn about the Munich Agreement, which was signed by Neville Chamberlain and Adolf Hitler inside the building.

Day 7: Historic Versailles

\$135 (5 hours, departs in the morning)

The reign of Louis XIV, known as the "Sun King," set new standards for decadence among the crowned heads of Europe. It took 50 years and 35,000 workers to turn Versailles, once a small hunting lodge, into the most magnificent château in all of France and the envy of royalty worldwide. On this excursion, you will see the palace in all its glory as you tour the State Apartments and the glittering Hall of Mirrors. Then, stroll through the lavish gardens to admire their fine statuary, splendid fountains, and colorful flowerbeds. You'll also learn about the palace's connection to WWII, including the signing of the Treaty of Versailles and the influence that the Nazi occupation had on the region. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.

through the Old Town and see where Nazi party rallies were held in the late 1920s and throughout the 1930s. Then, enter the Memorium Nuremberg Trials museum and see Courtroom 600, where the infamous Nuremberg Trials took place after WWII. Then, enjoy free time to further explore the city's charming Old Town and stroll along the Pegnitz river before traveling back to Munich. Please note: The Memorium Nuremberg Trials museum is closed on Tuesdays and Courtroom 600 may be closed when trials are in session.

Day 7: Dinner in Paris & Seine River Cruise

\$129/\$139* (5 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Take in the nighttime allure of the City of Light on a special evening excursion. The event begins with dinner at a local restaurant. After you dine, board a boat cruise along the Seine. As you coast along the river and under Paris' bridges, you'll behold the illuminated monuments of the city glittering alongside the riverbanks. Please note: The dress code may vary depending on the restaurant for your dinner. Your Tour Director will advise you on what to wear, but shorts and sneakers are likely to be considered inappropriate attire.

Day 9: Luxembourg Brewery Visit & Dinner

\$119/\$129* (3 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Enjoy a tour of a Belgian-style brewery in Luxembourg. You'll see the equipment the brewers use to create everything from lagers and ales, to stouts and bocks. Then, enjoy a tasting of some of the country's signature beers before heading to a local restaurant and sitting down for an included dinner.

Day 13: German Beer Tasting & Dinner

Make your way to a traditional Bavarian beer hall to enjoy a tasting of some of Germany's most famous brews. This region of the country produces a variety of beers including Helles, light lagers, Weissbier (a trendy type of wheat beer), and Pils, the most well-known and widely produced style. After sampling a diverse selection of beers, head to a local restaurant and sit down to eat a traditional German dinner.
