## Overnight flight → 1 night

### Day 1: Travel day

## Prague → 2 nights

### Day 2: Arrival in Prague

*Included meals: dinner*

Welcome to the Czech Republic! Meet your Tour Director and fellow travelers at tonight's welcome dinner.

### Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Prague

*Included meals: breakfast*

Discover why Prague is known as the "City of One Hundred Spires" on a guided tour.

- Visit Prague Castle, from which Charles IV governed the Holy Roman Empire
- Admire the soaring Gothic vaults of St. Vitus Cathedral
- Walk down to the Malá Strana district to sip a coffee at a local cafe
- Cross the elegant Charles Bridge for breathtaking views of the city
- Stroll through Old Town Square to view the 15th-century Astronomical Clock

### Day 4: Transfer to Kraków

*Included meals: breakfast*

Travel to Kraków, Poland and spend a free evening in the city or add an excursion.

### Day 5: Sightseeing tour of Kraków

*Included meals: breakfast*

Meet your local guide for a tour of Kraków, Poland's former royal capital.

- Pass Oskar Schindler's Enamel Factory and visit the old Jewish ghetto
- Discover Wawel Hill, perched high above the Vistula River
- Visit Wawel Cathedral to see where Polish kings were crowned

- Stroll past beautiful Sukiennice Cloth Hall and the Jagiellonian University, arriving in Główny Square

## High Tatras Region → 1 night

### Day 6: High Tatras Region via Ždiar, cheesemaking demonstration & Kežmarok

*Included meals: breakfast, tasting, dinner*

Travel to the High Tatras region to soak in the mountain views and experience the culture of the Slovakian countryside.

- Stop in the tiny village of Ždiar to view the painted wooden houses the area is known for
- Visit a Slovakian farm to meet a cheesemaker at their workshop and see how they make ornate egg-shaped cheese blocks
- Enjoy a tasting of Salash cheese paired with a glass of wine
- Visit Kežmarok and enter the town's UNESCO-listed wooden articular church to learn about its fascinating history

Continue on to your hotel in the High Tatras region and sit down for an included dinner this evening.

## Budapest → 2 nights

### Day 7: Budapest via Tokaj wine region

*Included meals: breakfast, lunch, wine tasting*

Pass through the rolling hills of the Slovakian countryside and cross into Hungary to visit the Tokaj wine region.

- Discover the history of Europe's first appellation, or controlled wine region
- Learn about the regulations winemakers must follow in order to create a true Tokaj wine and how these rules inspired the designation of other appellations including Champagne, Chianti, and Burgundy
- Tour the vineyard and wine cellar to hear about the characteristics of the wine

- Sample four types of Tokaj wine, including the famous sweet dessert varietal
- Sit down to enjoy a lunch of Hungarian specialties at the winery

After, continue on to Budapest.

### Day 8: Sightseeing tour of Budapest

*Included meals: breakfast, dinner*

Discover the major landmarks of the city that straddles east and west.

- Trace this nation's stormy history at Heroes' Square
- View the Gothic Hungarian Parliament Building located on the banks of the Danube
- Step inside the recently restored Hungarian State Opera House for a guided tour of the incredible new-Renaissance style masterpiece
- Cross the Danube and ascend Castle Hill and take in the breathtaking views from Fisherman's Bastion
- Visit the medieval Matthias Church, once the site of Hapsburg coronations

Celebrate your trip at a farewell dinner this evening.

## Day 3: Evening in Prague: River Cruise & Dinner

\$99/\$109\* (4 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

As the longest river in the Czech Republic, the Vltava traces a line from the Bohemian Forest up through Prague to the great River Elbe. Tonight, take to its serene waters aboard a cruise ship and marvel at The City of a Hundred Spires from its decks. You'll sail past Castle Hill and Prague's famous bridges, dining on authentic Czech dishes as you go. After having your fill of food and live music, dock once more and draw your evening to a close.

## Day 4: Polish Cooking Demonstration & Dinner

\$109 (3.5 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Pierogies are synonymous with Polish culture, and on this excursion, you'll learn the history of the country's signature food—and how to make it. Reminiscent of dumplings or ravioli, pierogies are traditionally stuffed with potato, cheese, cabbage, or sauerkraut, but can also be filled with cherries, apples, or strawberries and served for dessert. See how to cut, stuff, and fold the dough and practice by making both savory and sweet pierogies. Then, sample homemade cherry liqueur as you enjoy your dinner. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.

## Day 5: Auschwitz

\$65 (6 hours, departs in the afternoon)

This excursion takes you to some of the most chilling sites in Europe: the concentration camps at Auschwitz and Birkenau. More than 4 million people were systematically exterminated in these camps by the Third Reich during World War II. Liberated by the Red Army in 1945, Auschwitz has been turned into a poignant memorial to the victims of the Holocaust. Take a guided tour which includes views of chambers and prisoner buildings. Afterward, drive to nearby Birkenau, the second portion of the larger Auschwitz concentration camp complex. Embark on a guided tour before returning to Kraków. Please note: Full passport information is required to purchase tickets to Auschwitz. Travelers who have not confirmed passport information may do so by logging in to My Account or contacting Customer Experience. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.

## Extension excursion options

### Day 9: Budapest: A Walk Behind the Iron Curtain

\$99/\$109\* (4 hours, departs in the morning)

Discover the turbulent, tragic, and heroic history of the Communist period in Budapest on today's excursion. Your guided sightseeing tour passes the Parliament building, which was the starting place of the 1956 Hungarian Revolution and still shows signs of damage from the Soviet invasion. Visit Liberty Square, home to

the U.S. Embassy, a statue of Ronald Reagan, and the only remaining monument to Communist troops. From St. Stephen's Basilica, take the historic Metro Line 1 up the iconic Andrassy Avenue. Stop for an included coffee and piece of cake amidst the Neo-Renaissance splendor of a historic cafe. End the day at the House of Terror, where you will take a guided tour through this chilling museum and view the moving monument to the victims of Communism and Fascism in Hungary.

### Day 10: Budapest Cooking Class & Lunch

\$169/\$179\* (4 hours, departs in the morning)

Characterized by soul-warming soups, generous helpings of meat, and plenty of paprika, Hungarian cuisine is so much more than goulash. On this optional outing, you'll try your hand at preparing traditional and modern dishes, with guidance from professional chefs, at a local cooking school. Hear about the nation's culinary history, then learn how to make plates like chicken paprikash (well-seasoned, slow-cooked poultry served with egg noodles), fasirt (breaded, fried pork patties), and almás rétes (the local take on apple strudel) during a private lesson. Then, sit down for lunch and enjoy your creations, accompanied by beer or wine. Can't wait to cook them again? You'll receive a recipe booklet at the end of class!
