Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Frankfurt today.

Heidelberg Region \rightarrow 2 nights

Day 2: Arrival in Frankfurt & transfer to the Heidelberg Region

Included meals: welcome dinner
Welcome to Germany! Transfer to the
Heidelberg region and settle in to your hotel.
Then, meet your Tour Director and fellow
travelers at tonight's welcome dinner.

Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Heidelberg & Christmas market visit

Included meals: breakfast

Immerse yourself in the romantic cityscapes and Baroque architecture of Heidelberg on a guided tour.

- Wander through Heidelberg's elegant Market Square in the city's Old Town
- Explore the grounds of Heidelberg University, the oldest university in Germany
- Take a funicular ride to the city's rose-colored hilltop castle for panoramic views of the Old Bridge and the Rhine River below
- Spend free time exploring the city's festive Christmas markets

Swiss Alps → 2 nights

Day 4: Swiss Alps via Rhine Falls & the Black Forest

Included meals: breakfast, dinner
On the way to Switzerland, journey to thundering
Rhine Falls and through the Black Forest, the
setting for many of the Grimm Brothers' famous
fairytales.

This evening, sit down for an included dinner.

Day 5: Sightseeing tour of Lucerne

Included meals: breakfast

Get an up-close look at the lakeside city of Lucerne, Switzerland's idyllic Alpine town, on a guided sightseeing tour.

- View the Lion Monument, a tribute to the Swiss Guards who sacrificed their lives in Paris during the French Revolution
- Pass hand-painted facades that line the cobbled streets of the Old Town
- Cross the medieval Kapellbrücke, a covered wooden footbridge spanning the Reuss River, and view the Water Tower
- See the Jesuit Church, the first large Baroque building of its kind to be built north of the Alps in Switzerland

Enjoy a free afternoon in the Swiss Alps or add an excursion.

Austrian Alps → 1 night

Day 6: Austrian Alps via Liechtenstein, Innsbruck & Christmas market visit

Included meals: breakfast, dinner
Cross into Liechtenstein, a tiny Alpine
principality dating back to the Holy Roman
Empire.

- · Visit the capital of Vaduz
- Pass the royal family's hilltop castle, still in use as a royal residence

Continue on to Innsbruck, site of two winter Olympic Games, where you'll enjoy a guided walking tour.

- See the famed Golden Roof and the City Tower in Innsbruck's historic Old Town
- Pass the Hofburg, a former Hapsburg imperial palace, and walk into its cobblestoned courtyard
- Enter the Baroque Cathedral of St. James
- Enjoy one of the season's most enduring traditions as you sip mulled wine, browse winter ornaments, and wander among wooden stalls at some of Alpine Europe's most beautiful Christmas markets

Then, travel to the Austrian Alps and sit down for an included dinner.

Munich → 2 nights

Day 7: Transfer to Munich

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Head into the mountains of Bavaria making stops along the way to Munich.

- Make a photo stop at Neuschwanstein
 Castle, the fairy-tale retreat of "Mad" King
 Ludwig II
- Revel in scenic views of the Alps as you relax during free time for lunch in the town below Neuschwanstein
- Enter a Bavarian castle with a close connection to King Ludwig II for a guided tour

Please note: Castle entrance may be Neuschwanstein, Hohenschwangau, or Linderhof depending on departure and booking availability. Then, continue on to Munich and sit down for an included dinner.

Day 8: Sightseeing tour of Munich & Christmas market visit

Included meals: breakfast
Get to know the Bavarian capital on a guided tour

- Travel past the Englischer Garten and fashionable Schwabing district
- Enter the Nymphenburg Palace, the Baroque home to past Bavarian royalty
- Walk from Odeonsplatz through the Hofgarten to view the Residenz, once home to the Wittelsbach dukes of Bavaria
- Explore Marienplatz, Munich's medieval heart, and see the famed Glockenspiel
- Get introduced to the city's Christmas markets, the most festive seasonal tradition
- Explore the stalls in search of treasures to take home

Salzburg → 2 nights

Day 9: Transfer to Salzburg & Christmas market visit

Included meals: breakfast, wine tasting, tasting, dinner

Head to Salzburg, Austria—a city famed for its churches and musical history—where you'll spend the afternoon browsing the stalls of the *Christkindlmarkt*, or Christmas market. Cap off the festive occasion with a tasting of traditional mulled wine and cookies.

Sit down for an included dinner this evening.

Day 10: Sightseeing tour of Salzburg

Included meals: breakfast

Join a local guide for a walking tour of Salzburg this morning.

- View the University of Salzburg and the churchyard of St. Peter
- See the Kapitelplatz, Residenzplatz, and Alter Markt, in the city's Old Town
- Pass through scenery from the beloved film The Sound of Music
- Enter the 17th-century Salzburg Cathedral, built in the Baroque style

Enjoy free time in Salzburg or add an excursion.

+ Mozart Concert & Dinner

$\textbf{Vienna} \rightarrow 3 \text{ nights}$

Day 11: Vienna via Melk Abbey

Included meals: breakfast

Travel east through the Danube basin en route to Vienna.

- Stop in Melk for a guided tour of the town's Baroque abbey, which is situated on rock overlooking the Danube River
- Explore its Baroque pavilion, library, and chapel
- Continue on to Vienna and make a photo stop at Schönbrunn Palace, the Rococo Hapsburg home
- Spend free time exploring the city's Christmas market at Hundertwasserhause

Please note: On some departures the photo stop at Schönbrunn Palace will be replaced with entrance to Schönbrunn Palace on day 12 depending on the day of the week.

Day 12: Sightseeing tour of Vienna

Included meals: breakfast

Get transported back to the Age of Empires on a guided tour of Vienna.

- Step inside Belvedere Palace, home to the world's largest collection of paintings by artist Gustav Klimt, and admire the palace's impressive gardens
- Travel down the Ringstrasse, passing the Parliament building, Vienna State Opera, and Kunsthistorisches Museum
- See the grand Hofburg Palace, the Hapsburg's preferred winter residence

Enjoy a free evening in Vienna or add an excursion.

Please note: Belvedere Palace will be replaced with Schönbrunn Palace if the guided sightseeing falls on a Monday.

Budapest → 2 nights

Day 14: Transfer to Budapest & sightseeing tour

Included meals: breakfast

Travel to Budapest today, then discover the major landmarks of both sides of the city—Buda and Pest—with a local guide.

- Trace this nation's stormy history at Heroes' Square
- Tour the lavishly decorated interior of the Hungarian Parliament Building
- Cross the Danube and ascend Castle Hill
- Take in the breathtaking views from Fisherman's Bastion
- Visit the medieval Matthias Church, once the site of Hapsburg coronations
- Get into the holiday spirit at Budapest's Christmas markets, where you can enjoy public theater, folk dances, live music, and traditional food

Day 5: Mount Pilatus

\$185CAD/\$195CAD* (4.5 hours, departs in the afternoon)

This scenic excursion begins with a cruise on Lake Lucerne. After docking, ascend 7,000-foot Mount Pilatus on the world's steepest cogwheel railway. Legend holds that the mountain was named for Pontius Pilate, blown here by the devil after the Crucifixion. From the peak, the views of the Alps are stunning; on a clear day, you can see for 200 miles. Toward the end of your trip, you'll return to the base of the mountain via gondola. Please note: The cruise and cogwheel railway only run from mid-May through October. During the winter months, this excursion includes the cable car ride only. If the cogwheel railway is unavailable, you'll enjoy lunch on the mountain.

Day 10: Mozart Concert & Dinner

\$215CAD/\$225CAD* (4.5 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Step inside the 1,200-year-old St. Peter Stiftskeller, located within St. Peter's Abbey, to enjoy an evening of fine dining and music. Mozart composed over 600 works in his short life, and tonight, you'll hear his masterpieces accompanied by opera singing as you sample local delicacies during a three-course dinner. Please note: The temperature in the room can be hot in the summer, therefore we recommend dressing accordingly based on the season.

Day 12: Traditional Viennese Heurigen Evening

\$165CAD/\$175CAD* (4 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

After a brief drive, your first stop is Vienna's Prater Ferris Wheel. Take a breezy ride to the top, which offers a one-of-a-kind view of the city. Next, continue on to a picturesque village and sit down at local restaurant where you'll indulge in a festive night of music, food, and entertainment. Dinner will feature dishes typical of traditional Austrian Heurigens, or wine taverns. During your meal, you'll have the chance to try some of the tavern's own locally made wine—the perfect addition to your cozy, Old-World setting.

Day 13: Bratislava

\$135CAD/\$145CAD* (6 hours, departs in the morning with lunch)

Walk through Bratislava's Old Town on a guided tour of the Slovakian capital. Stroll along cobblestone streets in the shadow of Brastislavsky Hrad, the hilltop 18th-century castle overlooking the Old Town. Then, tour the famous Hall of Mirrors inside the pink Primates' Palace, where Napoleon and the Austrian emperor signed the Peace of Pressburg of 1805. Lunch is included. Please note: This excursion is seasonal and runs from November to March. If the excursion falls on a Monday, when Primate's Palace is closed, you will visit St. Martin's Cathedral.

Extension excursion options

Day 15: Budapest: A Walk Behind the Iron Curtain

\$135CAD/\$145CAD* (4 hours, departs in the morning)

Discover the turbulent, tragic, and heroic history of the Communist period in Budapest on today's excursion. Your guided sightseeing tour passes the Parliament building, which was the starting place of the 1956 Hungarian Revolution and still shows signs of damage from the Soviet invasion. Visit Liberty Square, home to the U.S. Embassy, a statue of Ronald Reagan, and the only remaining monument to Communist troops. From St. Stephen's Basilica, take the historic Metro Line 1 up the iconic Andrássy Avenue. Stop for an included coffee and piece of cake amidst the Neo-Renaissance splendor of a historic cafe. End the day at the House of Terror, where you will take a guided tour through this chilling museum and view the moving monument to the victims of Communism and Fascism in Hungary.
